



CCJJ – Commission Changes pursuant to House Bill 18-1287

Membership Positions Added

- The Executive Director of the Colorado District Attorneys' Council, or his or her designee
- One elected District Attorney, to be designated by the Colorado District Attorney's Council
- One member who is a victim/survivor, who has demonstrated knowledge of the criminal justice system and its impacts
- A person who is a former offender who has demonstrated knowledge of the criminal justice system and its impacts
- A representative of a nonprofit organization representing municipalities
- A victim's advocate

Membership Positions Removed

- Two elected District Attorneys
- One At-large position

Membership Clarification

A person who has been appointed and subsequently reappointed to the Commission by the same Governor in any capacity described in subsection (2)(a)(XI) of HB18-1287 may not be appointed by the same Governor to serve in any other capacity described in said subsection.

Revised Duties

On or before May 1 of each even-numbered year, the Commission shall request a letter from the governor suggesting topics for the Commission to study. In preparing the letter, the Governor is encouraged to consult with the Chief Justice of the Colorado Supreme Court and the Majority and Minority Leaders of the House of Representative and the Senate.

Sunset Review

The statutory authorization for the Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice is scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2023.
