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Upon completion of the entry level exam, all candidate scores are automatically forwarded to the Platte Valley Fire Protection District. Those candidates not receiving a passing score, will not be permitted to continue in the hiring process.

The Platte Valley Fire Protection District requires the following scores on the FireTEAM exam to be considered for hiring:

Human Relations: 75%Mechanical: 65%Reading: 70%Math: 70%

National Testing Network is a service provided to conduct entry level in a standardized, professional environment. National Testing Network does not replace the Platte Valley Fire Protection's responsibility and decision making in the testing process. All candidate results are provided to Platte Valley Fire Protection District where the final decisions are made.

Physical Ability Test (PAT)

Platte Valley Fire Protection District conducts an in-house physical ability test (PAT). The PAT consists of Structural Component followed by a wildland component. The structural component must be completed in less than 4 minutes 30 seconds. The Wildland Component must be completed in less than 3 minutes 50 seconds. If at any time during the test the time limit is exceeded, the member will be asked to stop. A four-minute rest period is allowed between the structural/wildland components.

Structural component must be completed in Bunker coat, SCBA, Helmet, and gloves. Wildland component will be completed with 45lb weight vest. Members are allowed to wear comfortable shorts and tennis shoes throughout the process

A. Structural Component (must be completed in less than 4 min 30 sec)

- 1. Climb to the 3rd Floor with high rise pack descend to 2nd floor, hoist one 2½ inch hose roll to the top of the floor, then lower in a controlled manner. If rope slides out of hands, you will be asked to complete hose raise again.
- 2. Raise and lower 24 foot extension ladder in a controlled manner. If the ladder slips, you will be asked to complete again.
- 3. Drag a 1 \(\frac{3}{4} \) inch charged hose line 75 feet Around a safety cone and return to starting line.
- 4. Drag a 165 pound dummy 35 feet, turned 180 degrees, and then dragged back to starting line. Dummy's feet must stay on the ground and the dummy cannot be picked up or carried on your back or shoulders.
- 5. Carry a fan 75 feet above the waist, turn 180 degrees, and place on a 4 foot platform

B. Wildland Component (must be completed in less than 3 min 50 seconds)

1. Carry a 40 pound weight vest 1/4 mile in Less than 3 minutes 50 seconds

Medical Skills Assessment

Applicants that are accepted into the testing process will complete an EMS medical and trauma skills assessment. The EMS skills assessment will be conducted at the District's Fire Station during your shift

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ride along. All EMS skills assessment components will be based on National Registry standards using National Registry skills check-off forms.

Shift Ride Along

Applicants that are accepted into the testing process will complete a shift ride along (working interview). Each applicant will spend 12 hours with a duty crew. This allows the applicant the opportunity to learn our District, as well as the opportunity for our crews to learn about you in an informal setting.

Oral Board & Executive Staff Interviews

Applicants that are accepted into the hiring process will be invited to an oral board panel interview. Oral board interviews will be conducted at the District's Fire Station. Applicants will need to be prepared to present an oral resume presentation that is not to exceed 15 minutes, followed by a standard panel interview. The oral resume should be presented using PowerPoint (or other digital presentation), follow a standard resume format, include pertinent information, and can include pictures, video clips, and other visual aids. Those successfully completing the oral board panel interview may be invited to an Executive Staff interview.

Please read each question carefully. Some questions have <u>multiple</u> parts. Please <u>type</u> your answers on a separate piece of paper. Each essay should be written in a professional manner (no specific format), and each question should be referenced at the beginning of each answer.

- 1. Your life is based on choices, with an outcome strictly of what you make it to be. In 400 words or more, what choices have you made in your life that have prepared you for a career firefighter position? These choices should be choices that you made knowing that a career in the fire service was your goal. Why do you believe this is the right career for you?
- 2. Our District operates by its R.U.L.E, which are our values (Relationships, Unity, Leadership, Excellence). In 400 words or more, how would you see yourself integrating into an established shift/crew utilizing these values?
- 3. Our District is on the 48/96 shift schedule. In 400 words or more, explain how (if hired), you will use the unscheduled time during each shift. Unscheduled time would be time that is not scheduled as training, inspections, etc.
- 4. You may have heard of the FULLY INVOLVED standard of performance (Mark VonAppen). This standard of performance includes the following:
 - a. Do your job
 - b. Treat people right
 - c. Give all out effort
 - d. Have an all in attitude

Explain in 400 words or more how you have and/or will meet this standard of performance.

Due Date: Essay responses should be submitted as part of your application packet.
