

Increase in District Court Filings Between CY 2013 and 2018

District court filings are primarily felony crimes; very rarely are misdemeanor crimes prosecuted in district court. Note these data represent *cases*, not individuals. The following tables and charts display this increase by judicial district, gender, race/ethnicity, and crime type.

Between 2013 and 2018, district court filings increased by 44.7%. Controlling for the growth in the state's adult population, this increase is 31.2%.





Statewide increase in filings from CY 2013 to 2018






Statewide change in composition of filings from CY 2013 to 2018: Race/ethnicity*


Statewide change in composition of filings from CY 2013 to 2018: Gender






































































