NEW Teen Community Emergency Response and Recovery Training (Teen CERT)

- **Denver's Disaster Ready Club** As a teen, there are probably a lot of things you are told you can't do. But there is one very important thing you can do: Learn to protect yourself, your family and you friends in case of a disaster.
- The Denver Disaster Ready Club (DRC) training teaches you about the potential disasters that could affect the Denver Metro area and how to safely and responsibly respond to and recover from them. It is a national program of volunteers trained in disaster preparedness and emergency response. Volunteers come from all ages and all walks of life, including teenagers like you!
- What: It takes about 24 hours to complete the training. However, the critical skills you learn will last your entire life.
- Why: When an emergency/disaster hits, we can't always depend on professional responders to be immediately available. We would like to have our communities trained to help within their own communities.

NEW Office of Violence Against Women Releases Campus Grant Solicitation

- Applications are due by March 20, 2015
- The <u>Office on Violence Against Women (OVW)</u> Fiscal Year 2015 Grants to Reduce Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking on Campus Program <u>Campus Program Solicitation</u> (PDF) was recently released with an application deadline of March 20, 2015.
- OVW's Campus Program is designed to encourage colleges and universities to adopt a comprehensive, coordinated, community response to violent crimes against women on campuses that enhances victim safety, provides services for victims and supports efforts to hold offenders accountable.
- The funding supports activities that develop and strengthen victim services and strategies to prevent, investigate, respond to and prosecute these crimes.
- Campuses are encouraged to create partnerships among campus entities, community-based victim services organizations and criminal and civil justice agencies.
- The solicitation provides further information to include the program purpose and scope, program and
 eligibility requirements, and application and submission instructions. The Office on Violence Against Women

Expelled and At-Risk Student Service Grant – Proposal Due April 1, 2015

- Applications are due Wednesday, April 1.
- Eligible applicants include school districts, BOCES, charter schools, alternative education schools with school districts, facility schools, and non-public non-parochial schools. Interagency agreements with local government, community-based organizations, and higher education are allowable.
- The funding priority for this competition is for eligible applicants that have not received EARSS grant funding in the past three years. Eligible applicants who do not meet this priority can still apply as funds may remain available after funding prioritized applicants. Fiscal agents of currently funded grantees cannot apply.
- The request for proposal is available for a new four-year grant cycle. Awards are contingent upon funding appropriated to the EARSS program in the fiscal year 2016 state budget. It is anticipated that grant awards will be based on \$1,000 to \$2,500 per eligible student served, depending on the intensity and length of services
