 - <u>Sources of Strength</u> (<u>NREPP</u> and <u>SPRC-BPR Section I</u>) is a program that trains diverse high school students to serve as peer leaders and connects them with adult advisors at school and in the community. Healthy Kids Colorado Survey Factsheets

• In the fall of 2011, a total of 1,614 students in 33 public middle schools and 1,523 students in 33 public high schools throughout Colorado completed the Healthy Kids Colorado Survey (HKCS), which includes components of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS).

- Colorado achieved sufficient participation in 2011 from selected schools and students that data was able to be weighted and can be considered representative of students in Colorado in grades 9-12.
