THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Happy Spring!

The Center staff continues to plan for the coming months. Please take special note of the upcoming trainings listed in this E-Update. These include the three <u>restorative practices workshops</u> scheduled across the state this summer, the <u>IHE Symposium</u> at Regis University on June 9th and SAVE THE DATE for the <u>2016 Colorado Safe Schools Summit</u> on October 12th and 13th. This year we will be hosting in collaboration with the Center for the Study and Prevention of Violence and Safe2Tell. The Call for Proposals for the workshops is attached here.

Review Working Group (RWG): The first meeting of the working group reviewing the Arapahoe High School reports took place on March 22, 2016. Eighteen school and community members were present with five others participating on the phone. The group laid out a plan for moving forward with a review of the recommendations from the three reports. Once the meeting notes have been finalized, they will be available on the CSSRC website.

The next two meetings are being scheduled in April. The working group hopes to have a preliminary report on their review of a number of the safety issues by the first meeting of the SB15-214 Youth in Crisis and School Safety Interim Committee this summer. A final report from the RWG will be available to all via the CSSRC website.

NEW Rules and Regulations Governing Schools in the State of Colorado – Chemical Hygiene Plan Template

- <u>The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment</u> has released the <u>Chemical Hygiene Plan (CHP)</u> as a template and guidance for School Chemical Safety.
- This document has been created to provide a template to assist schools with the development of a CHP and should be customized and completed with information specific to the chemicals used and procedures conducted within an individual classroom, laboratory, or area of the school using hazardous materials.

- Toxic and hazardous substances in schools have caused serious injuries to students and faculty in many states, including Colorado. These materials are a necessary part of curriculum and the maintenance of the school and grounds. The risks associated with the use of these materials is greatly reduced or eliminated when effective precautions and safety practices are implemented through the development of a Chemical Hygiene Plan (CHP). A CHP should act as the foundation of an effective chemical safety program at the school and is designed to aid faculty, staff, and students in maintaining a safe environment in the school.
- Because of the importance of a CHP, the Rules and Regulations Governing Schools in the State of Colorado (regulations), Section 6.12.1 (E), requires each school to establish a CHP which addresses all areas of the school where toxic or hazardous substances are used or stored. The CHP requirement in the regulation applies to all areas of the school where toxic or hazardous substances are used, stored, or handled by faculty, staff, or students.

Expelled and At-Risk Student Services Grant (EARSS)

- Sponsored by: <u>The Colorado Department of Education</u>
- Applications are due <u>Monday, April 4</u>. Application materials and a recorded training webinar are available at this link.
- This program assists expelled students during their term of expulsion, students at-risk for explosion and habitual truants. The program provides educational and supportive services through a comprehensive range of strategies that are proven effective to help these student populations.
- The funding priority for this competition is for eligible applicants that have not received EARSS grant funding in the past three years. Eligible applicants who do not meet this priority can still apply as funds may remain available after funding prioritized applicants.
- This RFP is being released for a new four-year grant cycle. Awards are contingent upon funding appropriated to the EARSS program in the FY17 state budget. It is anticipated that grant awards will be based on \$1,000 to \$2,500 per eligible student served, depending on the intensity and length of services.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Social Media in Educational Environments

- The <u>National Center for Campus Public Safety</u> (NCCPS) and <u>Social Sentinel, Inc.</u> (SSI) partnered to produce the <u>Guide to Social Media in Educational Environments</u>, intended to provide those interested in the safety of a school district, college, or university with insight into the use and impact of social media.

- Almost every middle school, high school, and college or university student in the United States uses the Internet on a daily basis and engages in some form of social media.
- Social media is defined as websites or other applications (apps) that enable users to create, share, and view
 content or to participate in social networking by developing personal or professional networks. According to
 the Pew Research Center and consumer insight service Experian Simmons, 92% of teens report going online
 daily and 24% of teens are online "almost constantly." This highlights the fact that mobile devices are
 commonly used in academic environments.

NEW Safe2Tell Monthly Newsletter

- <u>Safe2Tell Colorado</u> provides students and adults in Colorado communities and schools an increased ability to both prevent and report violence and other concerning behaviors by making a safe, ANONYMOUS report. Through education and awareness efforts, Safe2Tell Colorado encourages and empowers bystanders to speak up when they have a concern about their safety or the safety of others.

- This chart shows data which represents the number of reports received by Safe2Tell Colorado for the period between 2/1/2016 and 2/29/2016.
- In February alone, 764 reports were received. This is a 116% increase in the average monthly top volume as compared to February 201.
