THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Happy Spring to all! As we are winding down the school year I have just a couple of reminders for those who might have missed these previously as well as some new information:

- The Division of Fire Prevention and Control (DFPC) along with the Colorado Information Analysis Center (CIAC) and our office, issued a Fire Alarm Response Memo in February to address fire alarms and active shooter situations. If you are a school superintendent or have school security responsibilities and you did not receive this memo, please contact me directly for a copy. Christine.harms@state.co.us
- The CSSRC is also gathering data on **threat assessment protocols** in Colorado schools. We sent a link to this anonymous survey to **superintendents and school safety directors.** If you have not completed the survey, we ask that you do so now. This information will inform a working group that the Center expects to facilitate over the summer to create best practice recommendations for our schools when it comes to threat assessment. Survey link here.
- 13 Reasons Why on Netflix: You all remember the consternation last year when the first season was released having to do with the suicide of a high school student and the tapes discussing her motivations. Recently the Colorado Suicide Commission hosted Anna Mueller, Ph.D. who is a national expert on suicide. Here is her enlightening take on that series. We also continue to check and as of this writing, the release date for season 2 has not yet been announced.
- Finally on the legislative front: The Center has been closely following the School Safety Bill (SB18-269) for \$30 million in grant funding. It is our understanding that funding for some of the other school project bills will come from this \$30 million. However we hope that will still leave a substantial amount for districts in need of safety upgrades. As you are thinking about what your district might request in your grant applications, I thought this piece from EdWeek was a good overview of school safety ideas. Please remember that Brad Stiles (brad.stiles@state.co.us or 303.239.4321) is available to conduct informal safety audits at no charge as you make funding decisions. NEW School Interoperable Communications Planning and Fundraising Workbook

- As of Friday, April 27, 2018, Senate Bill 18-158 passed both the State Senate and House. This bill creates the School
 Access For Emergency Response (SAFER) grant program in the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency
 Management in the Department of Public Safety.
- The bill also creates the SAFER cash fund and directs a \$5 million transfer to the cash fund each year between FY 2018-19 and FY 2023-24 from the State Public School Fund.
- To help schools and school districts prepare in advance to take advantage of this opportunity when it is formally announced, <u>School Safety Partners</u> has posted a School Interoperable Communications Planning and Fundraising Workbook <u>here</u>.
- Interoperable communications enables schools and school districts to communicate in real-time with first responders during a school emergency.
- Over 10 years of pilot testing in over 200 Colorado schools has shown that a well-practiced interoperable communications program can: save and protect lives in the school; save and protect emergency responder lives; increase emergency responder effectiveness and coordination; improve response times, and reduce property loss
