NEW Announcement from Safe2Tell

Safe2Tell Supporters,

Two very important anniversaries are approaching, which have the potential to impact the number of Safe2Tell tips you may receive in the coming months.

The shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida, took place on February 14, 2018 and the Columbine High School shooting on April 20, 1999. Both tragedies have significant emotional impact on students across the nation and particularly here in Colorado with the 20th anniversary of Columbine.



We ask that our multidisciplinary teams prepare for an anticipated increase in Safe2Tell tips stemming from a heightened focus on school safety as well as the loss of life from these tragic events. NEW CDE Guidance: Reporting Sexual Misconduct in Schools

To meet Safe Schools Act reporting requirements, districts and institute charter schools must report student sexual violence as part of the School Discipline and Attendance data collection. The <u>Colorado Department of Education (CDE)</u> has released guidance on how to meet those requirements <u>here</u>.

New Title IX Proposed Regulations Released:

Title IX is the federal law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in education programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance (K through higher education). The definition of "discrimination" has been interpreted to include sexual harassment and assault. On November 29, 2018, the U.S. Department of Education published proposed regulations to finalize the repeal and replacement of previous guidance under the current and previous administrations. A <u>one-page fact sheet</u> provided by the Department is available, as well as <u>section-by-section summaries</u>. The Department has invited those who work at schools to consider how the changes might impact safety and comment on the proposed changes to definitions and procedures.
