THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Dear Colleagues:

- **We still need your assistance with the School Emergency Operation Plans Survey:**
 - Last month we sent letters electronically to all superintendents, BOCES directors, IHE, charter schools, and private school leaders.
 - The letter links to a survey that Governor Polis' office has asked us to conduct. The state is interested in knowing where schools (pre K through college) are in their emergency planning and what resources are still needed. We are trying to collect information on individual school buildings.
 - If you are a school leader and did not receive a copy of the <u>letter</u> and <u>link to the survey</u>, please access both here and help us get a substantial return so that state officials are aware of your accomplishments and gaps.
 - > The final report will be an aggregate of the results with no identifying information shared.
 - However, if you would feel more comfortable not identifying your school, skip questions 1 and 2 and simply complete the rest of the survey.
 - If you have not completed the survey yet, please expect a phone call from the Colorado Department of Public Safety. Thank you!

Legislative School Safety Interim Committee

- > The second meeting of the School Safety Interim Committee took place on Tuesday, August 20th.
- I had the honor of testifying before the committee and answering questions. <u>My testimony can</u> <u>be found here</u>.
- A number of the questions asked by the committee had to do with mitigating trauma while conducting school safety drills. The Center sent information about drills and trauma to the legislators after the meeting and we have provided copies <u>here</u>.
 - Two of the more salient points are:
 - Many schools are no longer conducting unannounced drills in order to lessen the possibility of trauma.
 - There are trauma-informed practices that can be used after drills to help mitigate the effects as described in this <u>article</u>.
 - The first two meetings of the School Safety Interim Committee are archived <u>here</u>.
 - The next meetings are scheduled for Friday, September 20th and Thursday, October 31st at the Capitol.
 - However, if you cannot make the meetings in person, the committee is requesting input from everyone on their website. That link can be accessed <u>here</u>.
- **Warning:** Season 3 of *13 Reasons Why* started on Netflix on Friday, August 23rd.
 - You will recall that the previous two seasons were watched by many of our students without adult supervision. In fact, <u>a study</u> supported by the National Institute of Mental

Health and reported in the Journal of the Amercian Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry saw a 28.9% increase in suicide during the month following Season 1 after accounting for other variables.

Update to COPS Grants

- "As most of you know, the US Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit ruled that the <u>COPS Office</u> does have statutory authority to award immigration related bonus points to applicants. This decision reverses a district court injunction that prevented the COPS Office from implementing its programs as designed. Once the Ninth Circuit's decision to reverse the injunction has taken effect, our office is prepared to launch the COPS Hiring Program (CHP) and the Community Policing Development Microgrants Program as soon as possible.
