School Safety Steps:

As we return to our schools this fall, it is imperative for building crisis /planning teams to assess for vulnerabilities within your school environment. Whether you have a new school, an established school or one where improvements have been made, a site assessment can assist in guiding the crisis planning process.

Site security/safety assessments can be performed by a small group of school staff familiar with the building. However, consider reaching out for assistance from local emergency responders, district staff or even neighboring district staff who may be able to provide that objective viewpoint of a school's vulnerabilities. Site assessments range from the very formal, with checklists and identified outcomes, to the informal consisting of a simple walk through and a discussion of any findings.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security has recently created a site security assessment guide and survey tool which can be found at: K-12 School Security: A Guide for Preventing and Protecting against Gun Violence (2nd ed., 2018) You can also find more information about site assessments at: https://www.colorado.gov/pacific/cssrc/vulnerability-assessment
