In a survey of more than 150,000 where 28,000 students responded at 27 colleges and universities in the U.S., it was found that:	
 One in 4 or one in 5 women, one 3 or one in 4 in LGBTQ people and one in 20 men had been victims of unwanted sexual conduct 	
 Only 13% of incapacitated victims of 25% of victims of forcible rape reported their crimes to anyone 	
• A large majority of victims knew their attacker

- "Have you ever forced someone to have sexual intercourse when they didn't want to by holding them down, twisting their arm, etc?"
 Civilian population: 5% of college age men said yes. Of that 6%, 63% were serial rapists averaging 4 rapes per rapist.
