Adult Sexual Misconduct in Schools: Prevention and Management Training

Do you know what to do if a teacher in your school or district is suspected of sexual misconduct?

The **Readiness and Emergency Management for Schools (REMS) Technical Assistance (TA) Center**, in partnership with the **U.S. Department of Education's Office of Safe and Healthy Students**, is pleased to offer an on-site training to assist schools in developing policies to comprehensively address the difficult topic of adult sexual misconduct in schools. This course is designed to develop and train key administrators and master trainers in developing policies and procedures related to adult sexual misconduct in schools. This training is being offered with the support of the Colorado School Safety Resource Center (CSSRC) and the Colorado School Districts Self Insurance Pool (CSDSIP).

TRAINING DESCRIPTION

As part of an all-hazards emergency management plan, it is important for school districts to understand how to prepare, respond, and recover from critical incidents. This includes incidents of adult sexual misconduct. Before an incident occurs, it is critical that all school personnel demonstrate appropriate behavior in order to prevent incidents or allegations of sexual misconduct, and be able to recognize questionable behavior if it occurs. Should sexual misconduct be suspected, the school community

needs to be able to respond appropriately. Finally, by working together, schools need to understand how to recover after an incident or allegation of sexual misconduct.

Created and developed by Seattle Public Schools, the Adult Sexual Misconduct in Schools: Prevention and Management Program is an in-person training curriculum providing a structure for school districts, private schools, and charter schools to comprehensively manage adult sexual misconduct. The training has two broad objectives:

- 1.) to train leadership teams in developing policies, building teams, and selecting trainers; and
- 2.) to train master trainers who can provide training to school-based trainers, school staff, and secondary students.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Ideally, teams of three to five people from participating districts, charter schools, and private schools who are human resources (HR) directors, executive management, school board members, and master trainers responsible for training site-based staff and secondary students.
