### **Morning and Final Keynote: Dr. John Nicoletti**

**Dr. Nicoletti** will analyze the latest school attacks discussing insider vs. outsider threats and how schools can minimize vulnerabilities. He will also lead a discussion on case studies reviewed by school threat assessment teams present.

### **Afternoon: Implementation in Your School or District**

Our panelists will discuss how threat assessment was implemented in their schools/districts. They will offer tips and share some of the challenges they have faced. Sample protocols will be available.

It is suggested that you attend with your entire threat assessment team: administrator, school mental health professional and law enforcement personnel so that you can discuss policies and procedures together.

Teams will also have the opportunity to work on real threat assessment scenarios with facilitation assistance by Dr. Nicoletti, our guest panelists and staff from the Colorado School Safety Resource Center.
