Anne Auld



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Anne Auld serves as the Director of Programs of Illuminate Colorado. Ms. Auld is an authorized trainer in Darkness to Light, Stewards of Children; a certified trainer in Kempe Center Primary, Secondary, and Tertiary Prevention of Sexually Abusive Behaviors in Childhood and Adolescence; Nurturing Healthy Sexual Development; Overcoming Barriers to Preventing Child Sexual Abuse; and The Period of PURPLE Crying® from the National Center on Shaken Baby Syndrome. She is a contracted trainer for the Colorado Child Welfare Training System on substance use and child maltreatment, and is a certified ACE Master Trainer. She has presented at national and international conferences on related issues.

Casa Milagro

Casa Milagro was organized in 2010 from the need for positive resources for youth afflicted by direct or indirect trauma and abuses. Often youth subjected as child witnesses to violence or abused with little or no substantive treatment for recovery and resolution, manifests in the continuance of violence and bad choices. We utilize the late Brazilian theater director, Augusto Boal's forum theater techniques from the theater of the oppressed (TO). It presents its message to develop one's consciousness to create resistance to violence in creating a path towards non-violence. In 2012 we brought in from the Bronx, Pregones Theater Company to train our organization on the TO techniques. We focus on reducing the 'powerless-ness' with root causes from oppression and social injustices. We have multiple performances all with a strong element of bullying.

Derek Ladd

Derek Ladd is an Intelligence Analyst for the FBI Denver Field Office who worked Violent Crimes Against Children matters from July 2015 to February 2018. Prior to joining the Bureau, IA Ladd worked in Loss Prevention and for the Missouri Department of Corrections. He earned a Bachelors of Science Degree in Criminal Justice Administration from Missouri Southern State University and a Masters of Science Degree from Missouri State University in Criminology and Homeland Security and Defense. Mr. Ladd is a member of the Evidence Response Team and an adjunct faculty member for the FBI. He currently covers the Violent Gangs and Transnational Organized Crime - Western and Eastern Hemisphere threats but has also covered the Violent Crimes Against Children and Violent Incident Crimes - Domestic threats.

Maria Trujillo

Maria Trujillo is the Human Trafficking Program Manager at the Colorado Department of Public Safety, Division of Criminal Justice. In this role she coordinates the efforts of the Human Trafficking Council. Ms. Trujillo joined the division in December 2014 after spending the previous six years in Houston, TX as the Executive Director of the non-profit organization, United Against Human Trafficking (UAHT). Prior to her time at UAHT, Ms. Trujillo lived in Washington, DC where she worked for an international development organization and obtained her Master's degree in International Communications at American University. She also holds a BA in International Relations from Claremont McKenna College and serves as a speaker and expert technical advisor on the issue of human trafficking at the national, state and local levels.

Rebekah Ottenbreit

Rebekah Ottenbreit works as the Title IX Coordinator and an English Language Development Specialist at the Colorado Department of Education. In these roles, she supports Colorado school districts in fulfilling their responsibilities under Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as well as in their development and implementation of English Language Proficiency programming. Rebekah has worked in education for more than 20 years and speaks three languages.

Robin Friesen-Holwell

Robin Friesen-Holwell, MS, LMFT is a therapist and program manager at Blue Sky Bridge, the child advocacy center serving Boulder County. She works with a team of staff members and volunteers within the Boulder Valley and St. Vrain Valley School Districts educating third grade students about touching rules and body safety. Robin gives a variety of trainings about the issue of child sexual abuse, how adults can recognize it and respond appropriately, and how adults can talk to kids about their bodies. She is committed to the goal of expanding awareness of these issues in order to create a safer community for children and families. As a therapist, Robin also works with children and families who have experienced trauma and are on the journey of healing.

Whitney Orndorff

Whitney Orndorff received her BA in International Politics from George Mason University, MA in International Affairs from Northern Arizona University and her PhD in Public Safety Leadership from Capella University, where her dissertation concerned burnout and secondary traumatic stress factors in investigators of child pornography offenses. She has been a Staff Operations Specialist with the Denver Federal Bureau of Investigation since 2011 and a member of Denver's Evidence Response Team since 2013. She is an Adjunct Faculty Member for the FBI, certified in Violent Crimes Against Children and Crime Scene Investigation (ERT), and a member of the Rocky Mountain Innocence Lost Task Force and the Denver Innocent Images Task Force.
