Issue/Topic Welcome & Quorum Failure

Discussion

<u>This meeting failed to reach a quorum and was abandoned.</u> Due to the failure to reach a quorum, Megan Ring, Co-Chair, did not call the meeting to order, but offered specific observations summarized in the "Next Steps" section below.

The only item on the agenda was to consider and conduct a final vote on Recommendation FY20-DR #02 (see below). This recommendation was prepared in response to the mandate to CCJJ in Senate Bill 2019-008 to develop recommendations regarding, "alternatives to filing criminal charges against individuals with substance use disorders who have been arrested for drug-related offenses." The **Diversion Working Group** was unable to present the draft recommendation for consideration. For reference, the following describes this recommendation:

<u>Recommendation FY20-DR #02</u>. Fund and Support Four (4) Innovative Adult Diversion Pilot Programs [Statutory]

This recommendation would establish statewide funding to support alternatives to filing criminal charges against adults with substance abuse issues who are contacted by law enforcement for drug-related offenses.

- Pilot programs will be conducted for a minimum of four (4) grant cycle years to mitigate against the obstacles common in startup programs;
- Programs will have an applicant advisor with appropriate knowledge/experience with the public health and criminal justice systems,
- Four pilot projects will be funded, representing diverse communities:
 - Two metropolitan (one large and one mid-sized areas)
 - Two rural areas high priority due to lack of resources available

ACTION:

Staff will schedule a meeting of the Diversion Working Group prior to the August 13, 2020 meeting of the Drug Offense Task Force.

ACTION:

The Diversion Working Group will review Rec. FY20-DR #02 and make revisions, if necessary.

Discussion

Megan Ring observed that Recommendation FY20-DR #02 was finalized by the Diversion Working Group in February 2020 preceding the COVID-19 pandemic, which has resulted in a variety of impacts on the criminal justice system. Also, Maureen Cain noted that the CO General Assembly completed a pandemic-delayed session on June 15, 2020 and some enacted bills may affect the recommendation. Ms. Ring requested that the Diversion Working Group: a) reconvene to discuss these and any other potential impacts, b) determine whether the recommendation requires any modification(s) to account for these impacts; and c) if required, to revise the recommendation accordingly.

Joe Thome and Adam Zarrin (Co-Leaders, Diversion Working Group) are expected to present Recommendation FY20-DR #02 at the August 13 Drug Offense Task Force meeting for final consideration and vote.

With that, no further comments were offered and the meeting was abandoned.
