# Special Work Group

## Report of the work of the Special Work Group, Jeff McDonald

Jeff McDonald reminded the group that, at the JJTF meeting on August 6, it was decided to ask the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice to allow the JJTF to present at the CCJJ meeting in September on why it should be allowed to remain in existence and work on revising Article 2 of the Children's code.

The request to present at the CCJJ meeting in September was made at the CCJJ meeting on August 8 and approved by the CCJJ members. A special JJTF Work Group convened on Friday, August 29, 2014 and prepared the draft of a presentation.

The JJTF members discussed the presentation and suggested revisions. A new draft will be sent to the JJTF members for additional inputs before the powerpoint is presented at the CCJJ meeting on September 12, 2014.

## Colorado Counties Executive Committee

# Report to Task Force of Co-Chairs discussion with Colorado Counties Executive Committee, *Kelly Friesen*

It was reminded that the Age of Detention recommendation was presented at the CCJJ meeting on June 13, 2014 and, that at the JJTF meeting in August, the JJTF group decided to defer the vote at CCJJ until the concept was presented to key stakeholders at CCI and CDHS.

Kelly Friesen and Julie Krow presented the concept of the Age of Detention to the Colorado Counties Executive Committee. While there was a general consensus with the idea of restricting detention for younger children, some concerns were expressed by County Directors that this age group population would consequently be placed into out-of-home settings within the County Department of Human Services (foster care or congregate care). Additional data was requested by the Colorado Counties Executive Committee on the number of children who did go to detention in the past years in order to estimate the potential fiscal impact at the county level. Some of the County Directors also expressed the concern that there was no adequate stakeholders' involvement in these discussions.

The JJTF members agreed to ask to defer the vote at CCJJ until key stakeholders are more engaged in strengthening this concept and support the recommendation.

Juvenile Justice Task Force: Minutes 09/03/14

Jeff McDonald and Kelly Friesen will report these discussions at the CCJJ meeting on September 12. The group decided that another working group with additional stakeholders will be formed in order to pursue the discussions of the Age of Detention recommendation. All stakeholders providing services to children will be invited to engage in the discussions (CCI, CDHS, Behavior Health Services, CDAC etc.) and the following topics will be examined: Alternative options to detention and home, Funding/resources, Data: number of children of age 10, 11 and 12 served by SB-94 and Child Welfare. Language of the recommendation: adding that the general intent of the recommendation is to ensure that best efforts are made to place children of this age group in least restrictive settings possible and not placed inappropriately in congregate care (whether residential or child welfare). Issue/Topic: Continue work on Diversion recommendation from the work group, Hon. **Diversion** Michelle Brinegar, Sarah Ericson Recommendation The discussions are postponed to a future date to be determined. It was reminded that CCJJ directed the JJTF to present on this work in September 2014. Jeff McDonald and Kelly Friesen will provide an update at the CCJJ meeting on the work of the Diversion working group.
