<p>Regarding a Potential Amendment to H.B. 2022-1229 <i>Stan Hilkey, Legislative Subcommittee Chair</i></p>	<p>Stan Hilkey convened the Legislative Subcommittee at the request of Subcommittee member Tom Raynes. Mr. Raynes requested the meeting to quickly review several amendments (see below) to <i>House Bill 2022-1257. Concerning the Adoption of 2022 Recommendations of the Colorado Criminal Juvenile Justice Commission regarding Sentencing Provisions for Offenses</i>. He felt a brief discussion of and decision regarding the potential amendments were warranted to determine whether the amendments were consistent with the intent of <i>Recommendations FY22-SR #06 (Revise Penalties for Unauthorized Practice of Certain Professions or Occupations [Statutory])</i>, and <i>FY22-SR #05 (Implement Individualized Behavioral Responses to Probation Violations [Statutory])</i>.</p> <p>Below are the specific amendments to H.B. 22-1257 shared by Mr. Raynes:</p> <p>Related to <i>FY22-SR#06 (Revise Penalties for Unauthorized Practice of Certain Professionals or Occupations)</i>:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Add the following language in Section 1, page 3: “if the person fraudulently represents self as a licensed professional”. 2. Remove “electricians” from the list of professions. The practice without a license would remain a misdemeanor offense. 3. Remove (VI) Direct-entry midwifery from the list as already included (VIII) Professional Nursing. <p>After a brief discussion and in accord with CCJJ “Legislative-Related Policies,”¹ the Legislative Subcommittee quorum represented by Stan Hilkey, Abigail Tucker, Janet Drake, Shawn Day and Tom Raynes agreed that the potential amendments continued to reflect the intent of <i>Recommendation FY21-SR #06</i>.</p> <p>Related to <i>FY22-SR #05 (Implement Individualized Behavioral Responses to Probation Violations)</i>.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Add an implementation date “Before July 1, 2023” to Section 3 (page 5 & 6) – <i>16-11-205. Arrest of probationer – revocation</i>. <p>After a brief discussion and in accord with CCJJ “Legislative-Related Policies,” the Legislative Subcommittee agreed that the potential amendment continued to reflect the intent of <i>Recommendation FY21-SR #05</i>.</p> <p>With no further business, Mr. Hilkey adjourned the meeting at 1:50 pm.</p>
