| <p>Regarding a Potential Amendment to H.B. 2022-1257<br/><i>Stan Hilkey, Legislative Subcommittee Chair</i></p> | <p>Stan Hilkey requested an email vote by the CCJJ Legislative Subcommittee at the request of Subcommittee member Tom Raynes. Mr. Raynes requested the consideration of members regarding the consistency between one proposed amendment (see below) to <i>House Bill 2023-1292 (Concerning the adoption of the 2023 recommendations of the Colorado commission on criminal and juvenile justice regarding enhanced sentencing)</i><sup>1</sup> and the related CCJJ <i>Recommendation FY23-SR #04 (Change Felony Crime Classifications and Sentence Enhancement Provisions of the Criminal Code [Statutory])</i>.<sup>2</sup></p> <p>As Mr. Raynes described via email, the amendment would make sure the provisions regarding “second look” hearings apply on or after July 1, 2023.</p> <p>Proposed amendment includes two revisions:<br/>Bill page 4, line 3 -<br/>18-1.3-406 (1)(b): “...FOR OFFENSES COMMITTED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2023,...”<br/>Bill page 6, line 8 -<br/>18-1.3-801 (6)(a): “...FOR OFFENSES COMMITTED ON OR AFTER JULY 1, 2023,...”</p> <p>In accord with CCJJ “Legislative-Related Policies,”<sup>3</sup> the Legislative Subcommittee members (<b>Stan Hilkey [Chair]</b>, <b>Shawn Day</b>, and <b>Tom Raynes</b>) submitted votes by email, 3-0 unanimously in the affirmative, that the proposed amendment continued to reflect the intent of <i>Rec. FY23-SR #04</i>.</p> <p>The consideration request was sent via email by Mr. Raynes on Tue., May 2, 2023 at 10:18pm and the email vote was requested by Mr. Hilkey on Tue., May 2, 2023 at 10:41am. The vote process was completed with a vote result notification forwarded to members on Tue., May 2, 2023 at 11:21am.</p> |
