VICTIM'S ISSUES

Standards Subcommittee

- Statutory C.R.S. 24-4.1-117.5 (2) (b)
- Subcommittee of the Victim Compensation & Assistance Coordinating Committee
- Recommends revisions to the standards for local victim compensation and VALE programs and recommends sanctions for the violation of the standards by local programs to the Coordinating Committee
- Members (listed in statute): Crime Victim Compensation Board members, local VALE board members, representatives of a local judicial district, Victim Compensation administrators, local VALE administrator, judge, elected district attorney, and a representative of a statewide victim's organization.

State Victims' Assistance and Law Enforcement Grant Board

- Statutory Board C.R.S. 24-33.5-508

- Reviews grant applications for the State Victim Assistance and Law Enforcement fund and oversees the compensation from benefits of crime fund
- Governor appoints 7 members
- \$875,000 funds awarded to 13 agencies
- Members must include: resident from Denver and resident from the western slope

- Meets 3 times per year

S.T.O.P Violence Against Women Act Grant Board

- Coordinate and integrate statewide efforts to bring about long-term system improvements in the areas of law enforcement, prosecution, legal advocacy and victim services in order to prevent, identify and respond to cases involving violence against women
- Executive Director of CDPS appoints 12 member board
- Members include: DV and SA coalitions and agency representatives, urban prosecutor, police officers, sheriffs, statewide expertise in victim issues, statewide prosecutor's Office, and court/probation representatives
- In 2007, \$1,838,834 was awarded for 60 grants

- Meets 3 times per year

Victim Compensation and Assistance Coordinating Committee

- Statutory Board C.R.S. 24-4.1-117.5 (2)
- Three responsibilities: 1) Reviews grant applications for funding from the Victims of Crime Act Fund; 2) Develops and approves standards for the administration of the crime victim compensation and victim and law enforcement boards and imposes sanctions for the violations of the standards; and 3) Oversees the Victim Rights Act compliance process
- Governor appoints 18 members board
- In 2007, \$5,349,544 was awarded for 133 programs
- Members includes police Chiefs, Sheriffs, Citizens, Victim Compensation and Local VALE administrators and Board members, elected district attorney, judge, victim, judicial district administrator, victim services representatives, and legislators.

YOUTH

Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Council

Focus: Juveniles Justice System – Priority issues include: mental health, girls, substance abuse, minority overrepresentation, appropriate holding of juveniles.
