2008 L-1 Decrease barriers to employment

...Abolish those portions of a statute that require the mandatory revocation or suspension of the defendant's driver license for a conviction/adjudication of non-driving offenses. This

2008 L-1 Drivers License Retention--Decrease barriers to employment ... Abolish those portions of a statute that require the mandatory

revocation or suspension of the defendant's driver license for a conviction/adjudication of nondriving offenses. This recommendation does not apply to child support enforcement.

Regarding jail good time credits

- Arapahoe County
 - 12 month period ending May 2010
 - 7,220 bed days saved (\$68/bed/day)
 - -\$490,960
- Denver County
 - 2008 estimates 29,200 bed days saved (\$55/bed/day)
 - -\$1,600,600

2008 L-12 EARLY TERMINATIONS OF PAROLE (DOC)

The Commission requests that the Department of Corrections develop and implement a standardized policy regarding early terminations of parole and require parole officers to submit such requests to the parole beard when a parole has served a least half of the parole period and has met other risk reduction benchmarks. In addition, the Department of Corrections should provide data on the numbers and decisions of early termination requests to the Division of Criminal Justice. The Commission further requires that such request comply with the Victim's Rights Act.*

- DOC Administrative Regulation 250-29
- From September 9, 2009, 1,573 recommendations for early discharge were submitted to the Parole Board.
- To date, the Board has discharged 1,377 offenders.

- \$2.1M grant on behalf of the Commission
- Evidence Based Practices: Implementation for Capacity--EPIC
- About (36 weeks) 1450 person-hours of training so far!
- 240 professionals trained including 40 judges

2008 CS-66 (DOC)

Grant 30/60 days behavior-based earned time credit for new intakes and current population (excluding TVs) serving time for non-violent crimes

- DOC estimates 146 beds saved in FY 2010 increasing each year to 342.5 beds in FY 2014
- \$2.8M in FY 2010 increasing to \$6.6M in 2014

Summary of Accomplishments

- 9,000 fewer people had drivers license suspended in FY 2010 (5,000/yr in future)
- \$2M in savings for 2 jails (\$5-10M statewide?)
- 1,300+ parolees discharged early
- \$3-6M/year averted in beh-based good time
- 100s professionals trained in EBP
- TV reform in probation and parole
- \$8M in new treatment funding
