Ex-offenders face many challenges rebuilding their lives after prison. Studies show that finding employment is a key factor in preventing recidivism.

Own Your Future has the tools and features to help find job and career pathways, understand barriers they may face and begin to move down the road to personal success.





Design Principles

To ensure we met the needs of ex-offenders, we:

- Conducted more than a dozen focus group discussions.
- Held workshops with incarcerated individuals in two local correctional facilities.
- Researched the barriers exoffenders face.
- Asked subject matter experts to review content as the site was built.






YOUR SUPPORT NETWORK

- -> Finding new friends and reconnecting with old ones








Why education is important

WHY GO BACK TO SCHOOL

Better pay and job prospects top most people's lists. But is that really the case? Does more education equal more money?

The answer is a definite YES!



- Professional degree
- Doctorate degree
- → Master's degree
- Bachelor's degree
- Associate's degree
- Some college, no degree

Annual salary: \$37,024

Hourly rate: \$17.80

Years of schooling: Any schooling beyond a high school diploma

Possible careers:

- -> Chef
- Food service manager
- L and a middle
- Real estate broker
- Sales representative
- Transportation manager
- High school diploma
- -> Less than high school diploma

Think about this: if you get a two-year associate degree, you could earn \$750,000 more in your lifetime than someone who only has a high school diploma or GED.

By getting a certificate or license in a technical field, or earning an associate (two-year) or bachelor's (four-year) degree, you'll advance in your career and, more importantly, your life! Employers will see that you have more skills and knowledge - which means you'll be more likely to be hired. It will be easier for you to keep jobs and get promotions. There are benefits outside of work too. Continuing your education can help strengthen your place in your community and your family.





- Research shows there is a drastically decreased likelihood of an educated ex-offender reoffending
- Even if education does not immediately translate into a job, education has been shown to improve confidence, which reduces recidivism
- Possibilities of finding a job increase with higher education

FIGURING OUT FINANCIAL AID

FAFSA FIRST

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the first required step to most financial aid programs. It serves as the application for all federal and many state programs as well as aid from colleges and universities and many scholarships. The FAFSA results help schools figure out what type of aid package is appropriate for you.

Even if you are not sure whether you will need financial aid, we recommend that you complete the FAFSA anyway - it's free. File the FAFSA as early as possible in the year you plan to attend school.

Some types of convictions may impact your ability to get federal student aid. During FAFSA completion you may be asked whether you had a drug conviction for an offense that occurred while receiving student aid or if you are subject to an involuntary civil commitment for a sexual offense. Get all the information Φ and a worksheet Φ to see if your aid could be impacted.

NOTE: Before you may complete your FAFSA, you'll need a Social Security number or green card 🗗 as well as a high school diploma or a General Education Development (GED) certificate.
