The Commission also conducted a "dot" vote to prioritize the
next areas of focus by the Commission. Three options were
selected from a larger list of topics at the February 2017
Commission Retreat. Members placed dots on posters
representing a preference between these three potential
topics:

**Vote on Commision Study Priorities** 

- Age of Delinquency
- DOC Population Drivers, or
- Sentencing Clarification.

Commissioners were also cognizant that two Interim Study Committee bills to be introduced in the FY 2018 Legislative Session include proposed mandates for the Commission to study:

- criminal penalties and sentencing impacts on successful treatment regarding opioids, and
- sentencing changes based on the most effective sentencing practices.

Commission members (with 19 members voting) prioritized the three topics as follows:

10 Votes - Age of Delinquency

8 Votes - Sentencing Clarification

1 Vote - DOC Population Drivers

Commission leadership will begin the process to seat a Task Force to study the age of delinquency.
