



FY2008 RECOMMENDATION/FY08-L07 BOND-TO-THE-COURT SYSTEM

Status: Partial Implementation

Actions/Updates

2012 UPDATE

Upon further study the Bail Subcommittee decided to pursue a different plan of action. See the FY13 Bail recommendations for further information.

2012 UPDATE

Sheriff Grayson Robinson is chairing the Bail Subcommittee to redesign and redevelop L-7, L-8 and L-9.

2011 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ACTION STEPS

This recommendation was proposed as legislation in HB11-186 along with recommendation FY08-L08. However, this bill was not approved by the legislature.

Sheriff Grayson Robinson to work with key stakeholders and lead the effort to redesign and redevelop L-7, L-8 and L-9. CCJJ Chairman James Davis or CCJJ Vice Chairman David Kaplan to schedule a meeting with the Governor to educate him on the history and importance of bond reform.

2010 UPDATE

This recommendation was partially addressed by House Bill 2010 - 1215.

2009 ACTION TO DATE

No action has been taken on this recommendation.

2009 BARRIER

Insufficient support by key stakeholders to move forward with this recommendation during the FY 2009 legislative session.

Description

Draft legislation to permit judicial districts to develop a percentage bond-to-the-court (see HB 08-1382), as is provided by the federal court system. Such percentage bond does not eliminate other types of bonds.*

**This bail bond alternative would require legislation to amend C.R.S. 16-4-104 and 105 and was drafted as House Bill 08-1382.*
