
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Figure 1. Colorado prison population, Fiscal Year End 1980-2020
















Correspondence of Colorado criminal court filings and new court commitments: FY 2000-2020





Colorado prison population: FY 2020







Admissions and Releases FY 2014-FY 2020






DCJ December 2019 prison population forecast

DCJ Summer 2020 prison population forecast


Comparison of DCJ December 2019 and Summer 2020 Prison Population Projections

Actual and projected total prison population FY 2005 through FY 2026: forecast predicts continuing decline throughout FY 2021, followed by slow growth through FY 2026



State population growth



- Very strong growth in the Colorado adult population is expected in upcoming years, particularly for those within the 24-44 year old age range.
- This growth is expected to accelerate through FY 2024 according to the state Demographer's Office.
- The Demographer's Office estimates growth in the overall Colorado Population at a rate of approximately 85,000 per year through at least 2028.

Criminal filings increasing





Prior Legislation

- HB 15-1043 created a class of felony DUI offenders
 - o 100-200 new commitments per year since FY 2016
 - Median sentences of 3 years.
- SB 19-143 Aimed at reducing TV's
 - Did not have expected impact: appear to be circumventing the limitations
 - Eliminated determinate revo periods, have no mandatory rerelease
 - Did eventually reduce TV's, but are staying longer
 - Too early to determine impact

Inmates with life without parole or lifetime supervision sentences, June 2001-June 2019





Probation revocations increasing




Over a quarter of new prison commitments are probation revocations


Probation revocations to prison increasing

Summary for slow growth

Population momentum:

- State population growth
- Filings increasing (though slowing)
- Any legislation introduced increasing numbers and lengths of sentences
- Probation revocations increasing
- Life/indeterminate sentences stack up in prison
- TV's down but staying longer
- Court backlog bump will be of NCC, so will stay approx. 3 years
- Releases will decline, those at PED already released, fewer will get to MRD
