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Victim Notification Criminal Proceedings

Concerning eliminating requirements that victims must opt in to effect their rights in criminal proceedings, and, in connection therewith, making an appropriation.

SESSION: 2019 Regular Session

SUBJECT: Crimes, Corrections, & Enforcement

BILL SUMMARY

Victim notification - eliminate opt-in. With certain exceptions, the act eliminates requirements that victims must opt in to effect their rights in criminal proceedings involving their alleged offender or offender.

This act appropriates \$784,542 to the department for implementation of the act.

VSU prioritizes review of retroactive enrollments by Parole Eligibility Date. Enrollments are expedited and prioritized for those inmates applying for Juveniles Convicted as Adults, Clemency, and Special Needs Parole to ensure victims have the opportunity to participate in the upcoming critical stage.

Of those 2,903 offenders (which has decreased from the 3,034 records reported last month):

- 12% (337) have had a COPD within the last year
- 5% (144) have had a COPD within the last six months
- 70.5% (2046) have applied for Community Corrections
- 9.6% (278) have applied for ISP direct



How many people are referred, denied, and accepted into the current “off-ramps”?

Key Figures from FY 20, averaged across Judicial Districts

For Residential Community Corrections:

- 41% of Transition Referrals were approved
- 72% of Diversion Referrals were approved
- 48% of Condition of Parole Referrals were approved

For ISP-I:

- 55% of ISP-I Direct Referrals were approved
- 95% of ISP-I >Comm Corr completion Referrals were approved
