Discussion

Kristen explained that due to the limited amount of time the Working Group has to produce recommendations, developing a new parole model would not be feasible by the 2021 legislative session. The group may want to focus on the standard conditions of parole, while continuing to review additional topics for future work.

Richard Stroker echoed Kristen's sentiment about producing a recommendation for the upcoming legislative session.

The group discussed HB 18-1029 (Concerning lowering the period of mandatory parole from five years to three years for certain felony offenses).

- Violent crimes five years on parole
- Non-violent crimes three years on parole

Members will review and discuss the bill at the next meeting.

Richard will distribute a power point regarding parole conditions that he presented to the parole board in Pennsylvania. The presentation addresses parole risk and needs, which are used to design and reduce conditions. Richard will also obtain conditions that parole boards use in other states. He asked the group to think about what is being imposed and does it really fit the case?

Richard suggested the group think about the length of parole supervision by using incentives. If an individual does the necessary steps and is successful, the parole sentence will be reduced/granted. If an individual who does not do the necessary steps and is unsuccessful will have, their time extended.

There was discussion about adding members to the Working Group:
