Issue/Topic

Felony Chart – Person Offenses *Michael Dougherty All*

Discussion

Michael provided a brief overview of Felony Chart for Person Offenses and the sections below:

- Crime
- Elements
- Statutory Citation
- Categorization
- Number of times crime charged
- Current Classification

Michael informed members that the Study Group (SG) will submit the draft of a proposal to the WG regarding the reclassification of destruction of life and property offenses to a Class 5 Felony from a Class 6. The Study Group is currently working on categorizing enhanced felonies into classification levels and reviewing the felony sentencing range.

Maureen added that the SG has also focused on addressing certainty in sentencing by adjusting sentencing ranges to reflect time credits.

Jes asked if there was a discussion of bifurcating the destruction of life and property. Michael responded the SG started discussing bifurcation around elements of harm but will continue the discussion at the next meeting.

Dan reported that the SG discussed arson and related arson crimes when a person's life is in danger and moving these crimes from property to crimes against persons. Dan suggested that arson be categorized in an enhanced felony category rather than a general felony category.

There was a lengthy discussion about the murder of a peace officer and the SG is considering classifying this crime into the extreme indifference category.

Michael suggested inviting Jocelyn Rhymer and Fran Lanzer from Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) to present what other states have implemented regarding driving offenses and vehicular homicide. Michael believes the presentation would be beneficial and would inform the discussion of extreme indifference.

At the next meeting, the group will continue to discuss the crime severity chart and felony sentencing grid. Michael expected that the crime severity chart proposal will be presented to the Task Force in the upcoming months.
