Mothers Against Drunk Driving	Drunk Driving (MADD) presented on Vehicular Homicide Recommendations.

Fran Lanzer, Jocelyn Rhymer,	
& Erin Agee	The presentation focused on recommendations regarding 1 st degree, 2 nd degree, and aggravated vehicular homicide and the elements of aggravated driving and sentencing ranges. Issue/Topic	Discussion
Enhanced Felony Severity Chart Michael Dougherty WG leader, All	Michael stated that the Study Group continues to review and analyze the felony-sentencing grid with focus on the development of a crime severity classification chart. Felonies in the Colorado Revised Statutes currently comprises six levels of felony class and the Study Group is preparing a five-level felony class model. The Study Group completed the review of the "General Felonies" and is about to complete an "Enhanced Felony" chart. The crimes will be separated into four charts: general felonies, sex offenses, drug felonies, and enhanced felonies.
	The Study Group has engaged in robust discussions about the classification of second-degree assault, kidnapping, first-degree murder, extreme indifference, and vehicular homicide.
	Maureen presented a working document for the Enhanced Felony crimes that illustrate current classifications and the recommended classifications from the Study Group. A separate chart was prepared for assault crimes.
	Jes expressed concerns about extreme indifference and the mental element of an individual's intention to commit a crime. Is extreme indifference a mental state or an aggravating factor?
	Maureen mentioned the Study Group has discussed this issue and agreed with Jes's question because extreme indifference can range from "knowingly" to "recklessly." Michael added that the group has also discussed extreme indifference for homicide/murder.
	Lastly, Maureen presented a document titled, <i>Other States Homicide Statutes</i> illustrating other states' approach to vehicular homicide extreme indifference.



Vehicular Homicide DUI (Current Class 3 felony)

- Maximum Sentence 12 years
- 50% Parole Eligibility 6 years
- Less good & earned time **4.5 years**

Vehicular Homicide DUI (if moved to Class 2 felony)

- Maximum Sentence 24 years
- 50% Parole Eligibility 12 years
- Less good & earned time 9 years

If a person operates or drives a motor vehicle in a reckless manner, and such conduct is the proximate cause of the death of another, such person commits vehicular homicide in the second degree.

2ND DEGREE VEHICULAR HOMICIDE

- Sentencing Range: 4-12 years
- Probation Eligible: Yes
- Parole Eligibility: 50% of sentence less good time & earned time

1ST DEGREE VEHICULAR HOMICIDE

- <u>Impaired Driving</u>: If a person commits DUI or DWAI, and such conduct is the proximate cause of the death of another, such person commits vehicular homicide in the first degree.
- <u>Reckless Driving</u>: If a person operates or drives a motor vehicle in a reckless manner, and such conduct is the proximate cause of the death of another, and a component of aggravated driving exists, such person commits vehicular homicide in the first degree.

1ST DEGREE VEHICULAR HOMICIDE

- Sentencing Range: 8-24 years
- Probation Eligible: Yes
- Parole Eligibility: 50% of sentence less good time & earned time

AGGRAVATED VEHICULAR HOMICIDE

- Sentencing Range: 16-40 years
- Probation Eligible: No
- Parole Eligibility: 75% of sentence less earned time
- Mirrors the current sentencing on 2nd Degree Murder cases

2nd Degree Vehicular Homicide + Aggravated Driving = 1st Degree Vehicular Homicide

1st Degree Vehicular Homicide + Aggravated Driving = Aggravated Vehicular Homicide

AGGRAVATED DRIVING COMPONENTS

Recommended:

- Causing the death of more than one other person (IL, NY, PA)
- Prior DUI or DWAI conviction in past 10 years (IN, NC, NY, OR, VT)
- Prior vehicular homicide, vehicular assault, or felony DUI conviction (OK, OR, NY)
- Failing to stop at the scene of the crash (FL)
- Causing the death of a child who is under the age of sixteen years (AZ & NY)

Recommended from CO Revised Statutes:

- Committing DUI or DWAI with at least one child in the vehicle (AKA child endangerment—which is considered child abuse under CRS 18-6-401)
- Causing the death of a vulnerable road user as defined in CRS 42-4-1402.5
- Committing vehicular unlawful termination of the pregnancy of another person as defined in CRS 18-3.5-107 (FL, MN, ND, OH, SD & WI)

We had concerns about these:

- BAC of .15 or more: (AZ, LA & NY)
- Driving under revocation or suspension (GA & NY)
 - In 2020, 45% of drivers involved in fatal crashes had previously recorded suspensions or revocations according to NHTSA.
- Committing DUI or DWAI with two or more impairing substances
