VOTE TYPES
Internal Policy/Procedure
Majority Threshold
Approve: When the total of "A" votes is approx. 51%.
Disapprove: When the total of "B" votes is approx. 51%.

Recommendation
Supermajority Threshold
Approve: When the total of "A" and "B" votes is approx. 75%.
Disapprove: When the total of "C" votes is approx. 30%.

+ Mandatory Parole Subcommittee

* With 21 Commissioners voting, these supermajority votes required 16 votes (A or B) for recommendation approval OR 6 votes (C) for recommendation disapproval.

◊ Following up a discussion from the February 2016 Retreat, the Commission voted [via an internal policy/majority vote] to modify the supermajority approval threshold. Starting in FY17 the threshold will shift from approximately 75% to approximately 66% to approve recommendations.
