



## National Criminal Justice Reform Project

- Letter of Interest submitted in July to participate in 20-state convening
- Colorado chosen to participate
- Two day summit to be held in Denver, October 17-19
  - Analyze state-level survey data to help identify priorities for reform, and
  - Acquire information about the NCJRP and selection process for ongoing training and technical assistance



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- Colorado's proposal
  - Acceptance based on the letter of interest submitted by Governor Hickenlooper describing the need for better collection and integration of criminal justice data, with an emphasis on jail data and the intersection of criminal justice and behavioral health data
  - The Adams County Information Sharing Exchange project and the CCJJ Mental Health/Jails focus were also used as examples of ongoing work
