Sias/Sen. Kagan</p>	<p>Passed the House 64-0.             Introduced and assigned to Senate Judiciary</p>
<p><b>Update the Statutory Conditions of Parole to Reflect Contemporary and Evidence Based Common Practices</b>  <i>Update the statute governing parole conditions, C.R.S. 17-2-201, to give the parole board and community parole officers discretion to select individualized conditions of parole.</i>  <i>[Recommendation: FY16-RE #01]</i></p>	<p>TBD</p>	<p>Not yet introduced</p>
<p><b>New Community Corrections Reentry Referral Process</b>  <i>The referral process will include revisions to these five elements of the process to refer inmates to community corrections: 1) COV and Non-COV offender referrals, 2) Community referral packets, 3) COV and Non-COV offender program acceptance/approval process, 4) community corrections boards utilize structured, research-based decision-making, and 5) Repeal the statutory definition of Intensive Supervision Program-Inmate.</i>  <i>[Recommendation: FY17- CC #01]</i></p>	<p>TBD</p>	<p>Not yet introduced</p>
<p><b>SB 207 Strengthen a Community-Based Crisis Response</b>  <i>Position the Colorado Crisis Services System as the comprehensive response to behavioral health emergencies in all Colorado communities by making the following reforms: a) Strengthen and enhance existing crisis services and resources; b) Amend §27-60-103 to clarify the intent of the crisis system; c) Undertake conforming regulatory changes to crisis system contracting; and d) Commit resources to incentivize the development and expansion of the crisis services provider network.</i>  <i>[Recommendation: FY17- MH #01]</i></p>	<p>Sias &amp; Salazar/Kagan &amp; Cooke</p>	<p>Introduced and assigned to Senate Judiciary</p>

<p><b>SB 207 Changes to Emergency Mental Health Commitment Statute</b>  <i>Amend Title 27 of Colorado Revised Statutes (C.R.S), section 65-105, to remove jails and correctional facilities as a placement option for individuals on an M1 (emergency mental health) hold. Introduce language that allows intervening professionals to transport individuals to an outpatient facility for immediate evaluation for treatment based on evidence of need.</i>  <i>[Recommendation: FY17-MH #02]</i></p>	<p>Sias &amp; Salazar/Kagan &amp; Cooke</p>	<p>Introduced and assigned to Senate Judiciary</p>
<p><b>Early Discharge from Lifetime Supervision for Sex Offenders due to Disability or Incapacitation</b>  <i>Offenders sentenced under the Lifetime Supervision Act who suffer from a severe disability to the extent they are deemed incapacitated and unable to benefit from supervision and who do not present an unacceptable level of risk to public safety may petition the court for early discharge from probation supervision.</i>  <i>[Recommendation: FY15-CS #01]</i></p>	<p>TBD</p>	<p>Not yet introduced</p>
<p><b>Eliminate Colorado's Extraordinary Risk Statute</b>  <i>Eliminates the extraordinary risk statutes and makes corresponding changes.</i>  <i>[Recommendation: FY13-CS #03]</i></p>	<p>TBD</p>	<p>Not yet introduced</p>
<p><b>Address inconsistencies in the unlawful sexual contact statute</b>  <i>Repeal the current mandatory prison sentence provisions for commission of unlawful sexual contact by force, threat, or intimidation, 18-3-404(3), CRS.</i>  <i>[Recommendation: FY11-SO #17]</i></p>	<p>TBD</p>	<p>Not yet introduced</p>
