

CCJJ 2017 Retreat Outcomes / Details: Top 3 Potential Areas for Future Work

Pretrial/Bond (Implemented June 2017 via Pretrial Release Task Force)

- Use of CCJJ Bail/Bond law
- Barriers to implementation
- Supervision
- Communication among professionals involved
- Use of risk assessment – which ones?
- Bond schedules/consistency

Sentencing Clarification

- Focus on DOC eligible sentences
- Truth in sentencing (for defendants and victims) / Simplification
- Community Corrections eligibility date
- Information about PED for victims
- Different schemes/grids – drugs, violent, property

FYI: The “next step” topics identified by the Comp. Sentencing TF upon its conclusion (April 2014):

- Habitual offenders - filing practices; weighing prior convictions
- *Recent impacts on county jails - mandatory DUI; Mental health pop.; “frequent flyers”*
- Mandatory consecutive sentences - conflicts with evidence-based sentencing practices
- Sex offense work - eligibility criteria for removal from lifetime supervision.

Age of Delinquency: onset and 18-25 year olds

- Brain development research
- Appropriate assessment tools
- Is treatment appropriate given brain development
- Legitimacy of research
- Index crime
- YOS
