
# National Crime Trends

- Due to changes in FBI crime reporting requirements there is no "national crime" rate for 2021 and it is unclear when it will be calculated again
- The FBI moved exclusively to "incident-based" reporting in 2021
- States that have not met the incident-based reporting requirement include: Arizona, California, Florida, Illinois, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, & Pennsylvania



### Violent Crime Rate Trends in Colorado






## Violent Crime Rate Change in Colorado



### Homicide Rate Trends in Colorado












## Property Crime Rate Change in Colorado



## Motor Vehicle Theft & Clearance Rates







# Drug Arrest Downward Trends





# Drug Arrest Upward Trends







Total Pounds of Synthetic Narcotics Seized



## Fentanyl Seizures reported by RMHIDTA
















### Change in District Court Felony Filings, FY 21 to FY 22


### Change in County Court Misdemeanor Filings, FY 21 to FY 22

# Jail Average Daily Population





### **Community Corrections Population**










Figure 2. Actual prison population FY 2015 through December 2022 with comparison of current DCJ prison population forecast to November 2021 forecast and June 2022 interim forecast




### Youth Offender Services Population



### Division of Youth Services Commitments







Figure 17. Monthly detention year-to date average daily population, FY 2012 through December 2022










New Juvenile Probationers Fiscal Years 2013 to 2022
