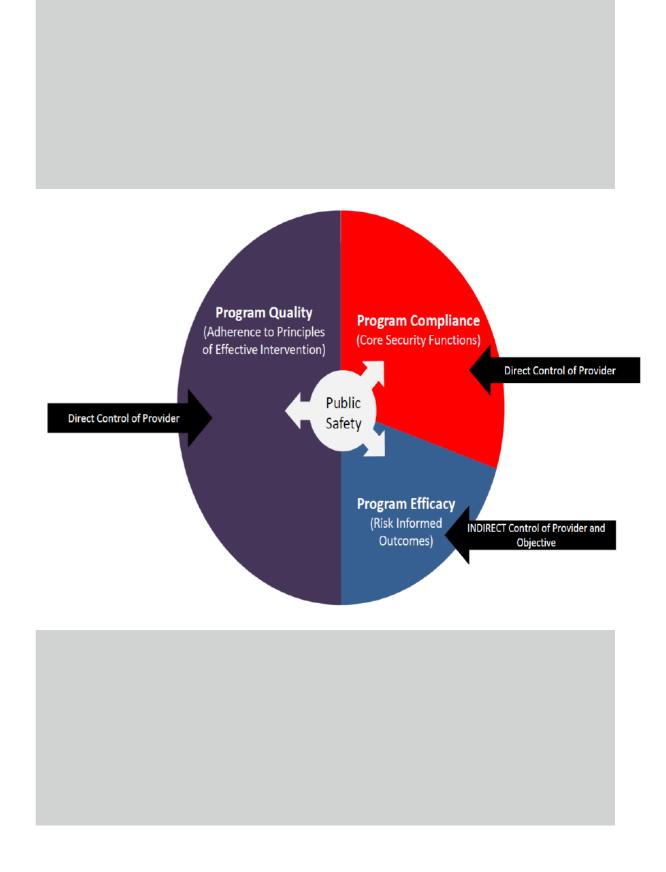

The 2015 PBC Plan

Public Safety is comprised of three interdependent domains:

- 1) Compliance with core security functions,
- 2) Adherence to the Principles of Effective Intervention (program quality), and
- 3) Program efficacy using risk-informed outcomes.

• What is the Core Security audit?

The Core Security Audit measures adherence to the *Colorado Community Corrections Standards (C.C.C.S.)*. This audit reviews the level of compliance and quality of work with a limited number of the Standards using multiple measurement methods.

UI- Recommendations

Recommendation to focus on specific measures with in the CORE for a performance cycle

• Select 2-3 standards or areas of the CORE to incentivize for the performance cycle

• PBC does not replace the regulatory role of the DCJ. The OCC will still need to conduct audits.
