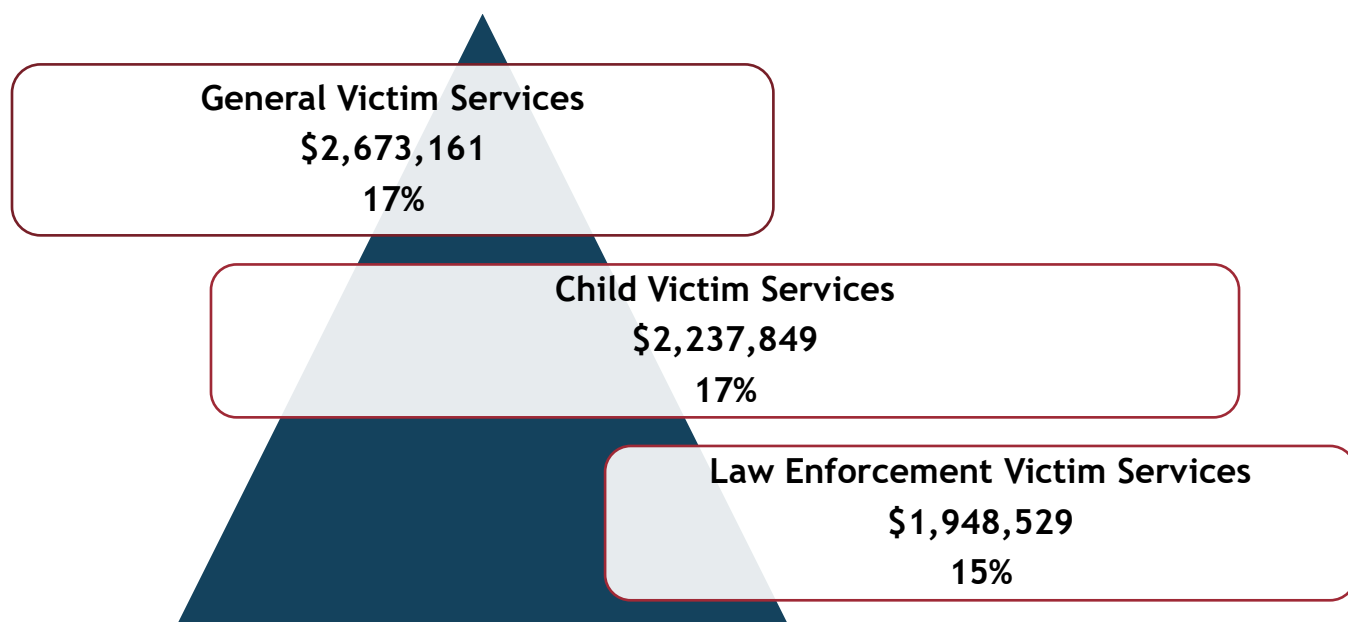
## Colorado Local VALE 2022 Annual Report Executive Summary

Colorado's local Victim and Witness Assistance and Law Enforcement (VALE) funding structure is unique in the nation. There is no other state that has legislated local funding for agencies providing direct services to crime victims.

- \$12,991,459 Total Local VALE Grant Funds Disbursed
- \$9,994,633 Local VALE Funds Disbursed for Agency Services
- \$2,886,743 Supplemental ARPA Funds Disbursed for Agency Services
- \$110,083 Local VALE Funds Disbursed for Victim Services Training
- \$12,300,708 Total Local VALE Program Collections for Grants

### CY 2022 Colorado Top 3 Local VALE Funded Victim Services

### Local VALE Annual Reports

C.R.S. §24-4.2-108 mandates that each local VALE program submit to the Division of Criminal Justice an annual report detailing:

- 1) Amount of funds granted to agencies;
- 2) Number and type of agencies applying for grant funds; and,
- 3) Projects and services for which grants were awarded.

The local VALE annual report reflects the information provided by each local VALE program for a calendar year (CY) period of January 1 through December 31. Individual judicial district local VALE program activity for CY 2022 begins on page 18. ## CY 2022 Local VALE Summary Grant and Scholarship Awards

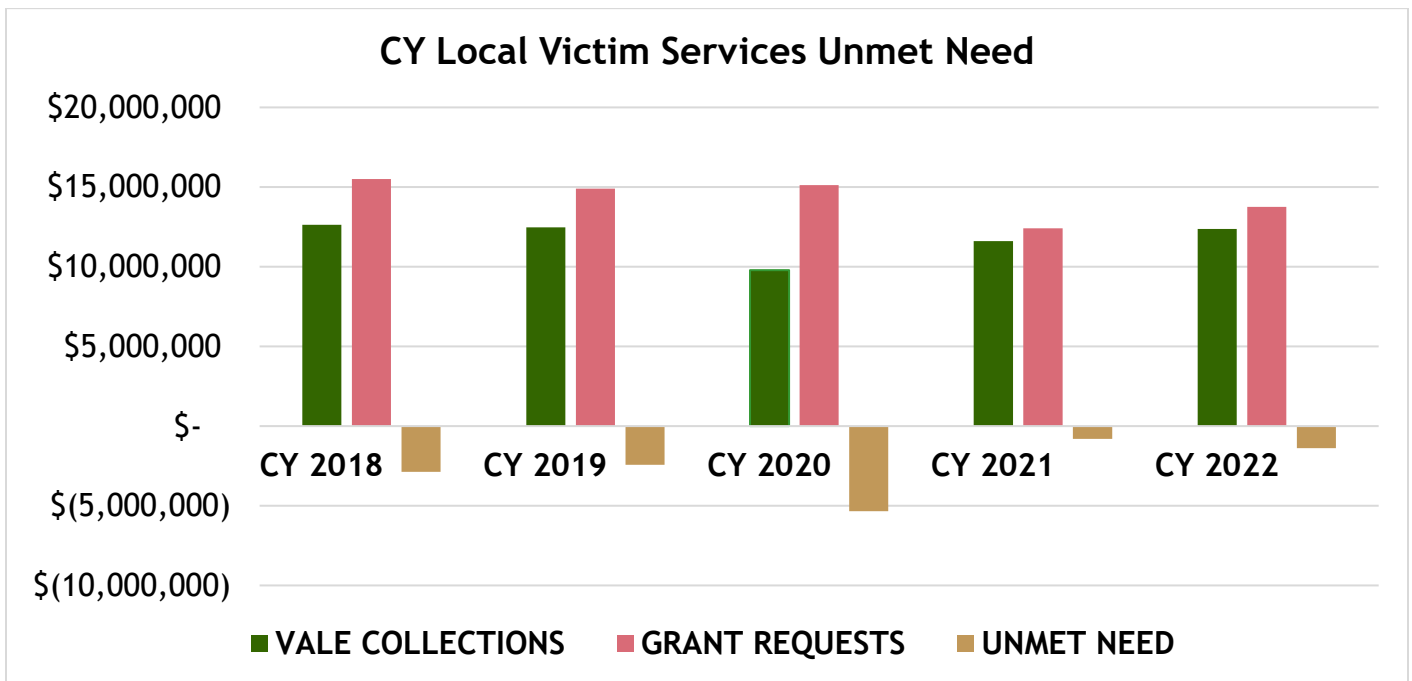
During CY 2022, 307 grants and 53 scholarships were awarded to various organizations by local Victim Assistance and Law Enforcement boards. Approximately 10% more local VALE Grant funds were awarded for calendar year 2022 than calendar year 2021. Local VALE funds collected in calendar year 2022 increased approximately 6% from calendar year 2021.

## Colorado Local VALE Programs Ability to Meet Crime Victim Needs

On average, annual state revenue collected for local VALE programs over the past decade has been sufficient to pay **only 80% of funds requested by agencies to provide direct services to victims in their communities**. Other possible sources of funding to pay for these critical services include the competitive grant process for federal funds from the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) and the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA).

The chart below shows the percentage difference between the dollar amount of local VALE grant requests received and the dollar amount of local VALE funds available for allocation. This chart illustrates that over the past five years, local VALE programs have received an average of 20% more in requests than funds available. CY 2022 figures do not include the additional ARPA funds received by local judicial district VALE programs.

## Colorado Local VALE Statutory Structure

---

In 1984, the General Assembly approved legislation to establish the Assistance to Victims of and Witnesses to Crimes and Aid to Law Enforcement Act (VALE). The VALE Act has been amended several times since its original passage in 1984. The legislation established a funding mechanism for agencies to provide services to crime victims through local VALE programs established in each of Colorado's 22 judicial districts. The VALE statute outlines services for crime victims that may be considered for funding. Each judicial district is responsible for the administration, financial management, and decisions regarding its local VALE funds. Each judicial district local VALE program maintains bylaws, policies and procedures which are updated annually.

The Crime Victim Services Advisory Board (Advisory Board) is responsible for the development of, revisions to, and compliance with the *Standards for the Administration of Victim and Witness & Law Enforcement Programs (Standards)*. The *Standards* were established in 1992 and have been amended periodically.

### Local VALE Funding Decision Making

The Act provides for a five-member board (appointed by the Chief Judge) in each judicial district. Each local board accepts applications and makes decisions regarding the use of local VALE funds in that judicial district.

### Local VALE Funding Priorities

There are two priority funding areas for local VALE funding pursuant to current Colorado statute. Funding for programs that have statutory responsibilities pursuant to the Victim Rights Act (C.R.S. §24-4.1-302.5; §24-4.1-303; and §24-4.1-304).

- Funding for victim and witness services which are listed in C.R.S. §24-4.2-105(4). This includes, but is not limited to, crisis intervention services, referrals of victims to appropriate community services and victim compensation programs, translator services and counseling.

Per Colorado statute, agencies may submit a grant application for funding in the judicial district where services are being, or will be, provided. Local VALE revenue is generally insufficient to fully fund all grant application requests for direct victim services. For that reason, local VALE programs may also require agencies to demonstrate that they have sought other funding sources to pay for direct victim services. Additional information regarding a specific VALE program is available by contacting the judicial district VALE Program Administrator.

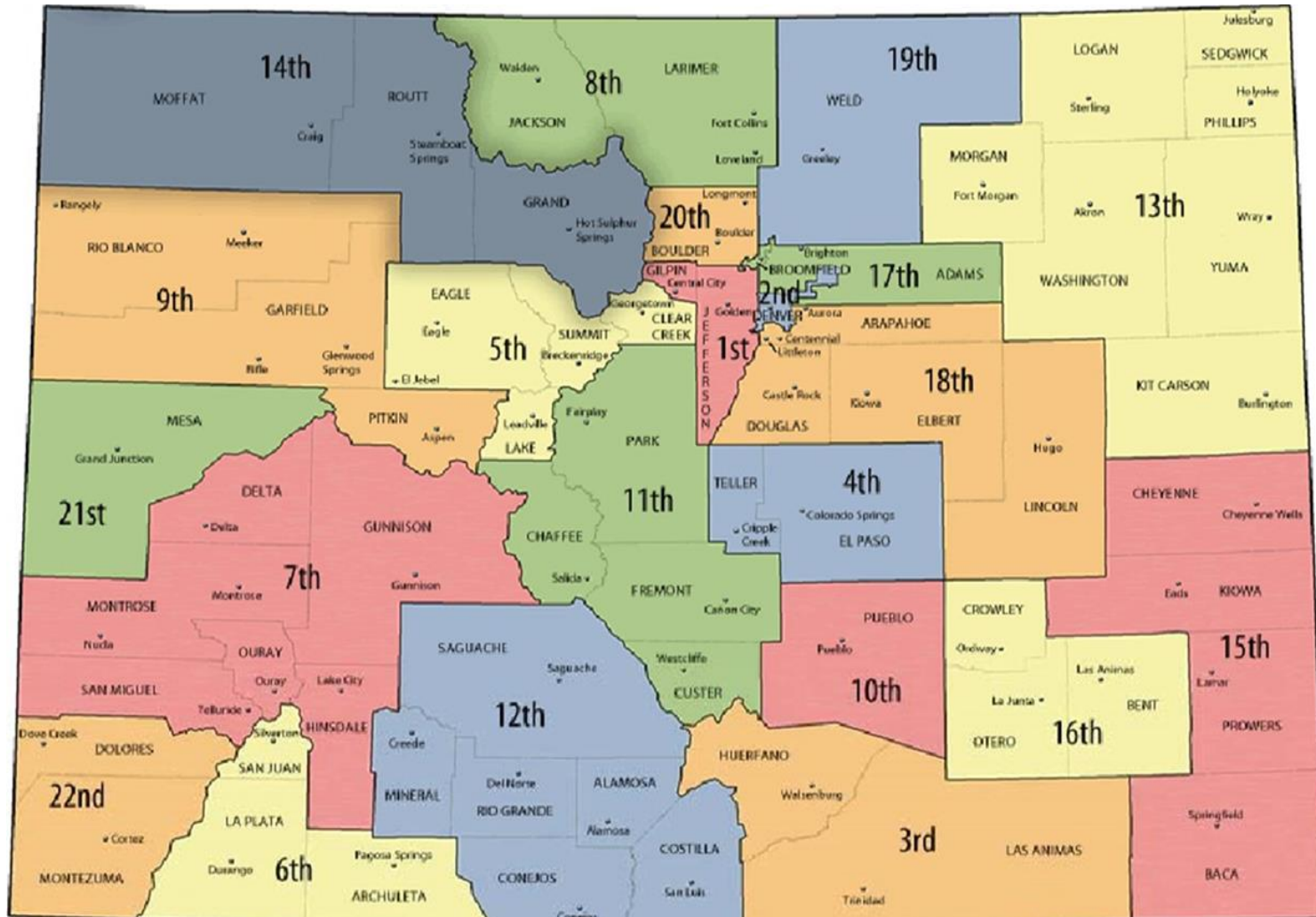

## Colorado Local VALE Funding Sources

---

### State Criminal Fines and Surcharges

Local VALE Programs in Colorado's 22 judicial districts receive funding from fines and surcharges assessed, and collected, at both the state and federal level. Local VALE funds are assessed and collected from offenders who are convicted of, or receive a deferred sentence for, crimes and/or traffic offenses.

Local VALE fines and surcharges are assessed and collected at the local judicial district level, by statute, as follows:

Felony                      \$163.00

Misdemeanor            \$78.00

Class 1 Misdemeanor Traffic Offenses    \$46.00

Class 2 Misdemeanor Traffic Offenses    \$33.00

Class A or class B traffic infraction - as delineated in C.R.S. §24-4.1-119 (f)(I) and C.R.S. §42-4-1701 (4). *(Fees vary as to the type of infraction.)*

**Statutory surcharges assessed and collected by the courts comprise 72% of local VALE funding.** Waiving the assessment of VALE surcharges by judges for criminal convictions *significantly* impacts the level of funding available in local judicial districts for direct services to crime victims and survivors.

The other major funding source for local VALE funding is deposits of unclaimed restitution (19%). Pursuant to C.R.S. § 16-18.5-109 when no victim can be reasonably located, or the victim declines to accept restitution ordered from a criminal action, restitution shall be paid to the local VALE fund or the CVC fund in the judicial district where the crime occurred. Annually, the VALE Board chair, in consultation with the VALE Board, and the CVC Board chair, in consultation with the CVC Board, designate how unclaimed or declined restitution funds are divided between the two funds for the next calendar year.

In the majority of judicial districts, the local VALE fund is designated to receive unclaimed or declined restitution funds. This is largely due to the ability of local CVC programs to request, and receive, federal VC funds if needed. Colorado currently does not have any other funding options for local VALE programs.

## CY 2022 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds

Funding for VALE programs was negatively impacted during the COVID pandemic period when there was a significant decrease in the collection of court costs and surcharges. On March 11, 2021 the federal government enacted the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" (ARPA) to provide support to state, local, and tribal governments in responding to the impact of the COVID-19 public health emergency and to assist them in their efforts to contain the effects of the COVID-19 public health emergency on their communities, residents, and businesses.

For state fiscal year 2022, the act appropriated \$3,000,000 from the economic recovery and relief cash fund to the State Court Administrator's Office (SCAO) of the Judicial Branch to be distributed to Colorado's 22 local VALE Programs. ARPA funds were used to fill the gap in the loss of revenue for local VALE programs during the COVID pandemic period. All allocated ARPA funds for local VALE programs were required to be fully expended by June 30, 2022.

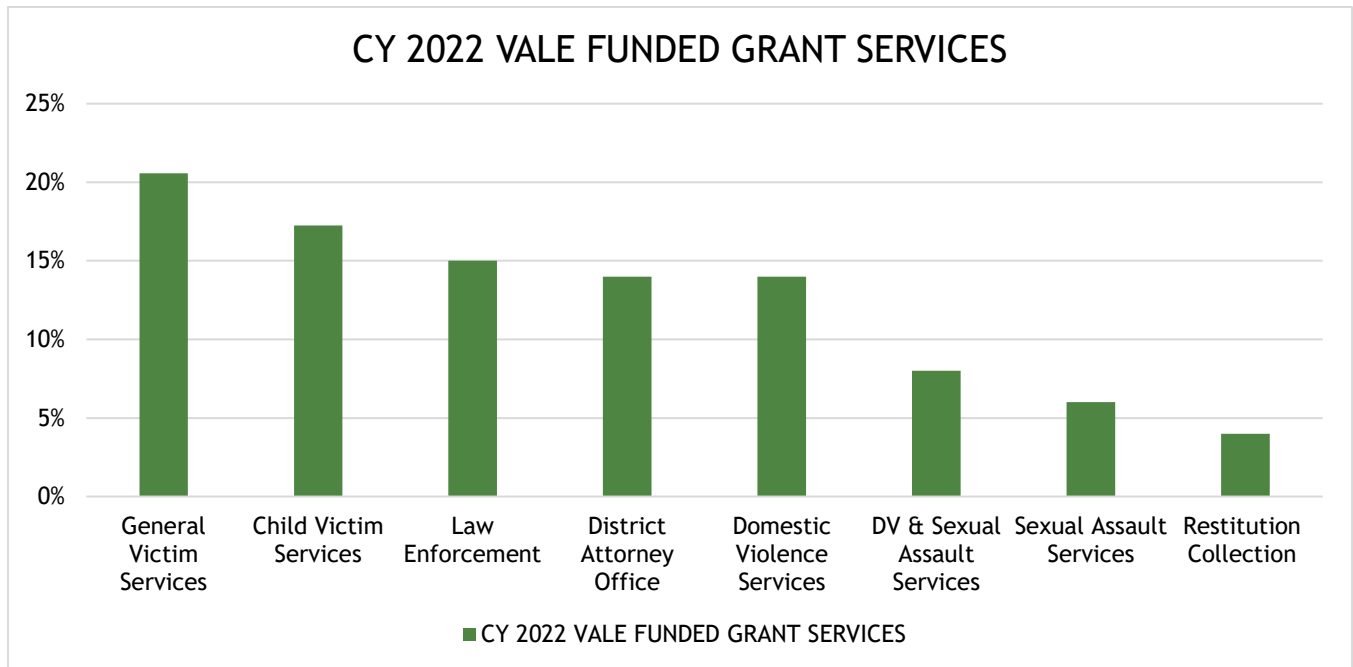

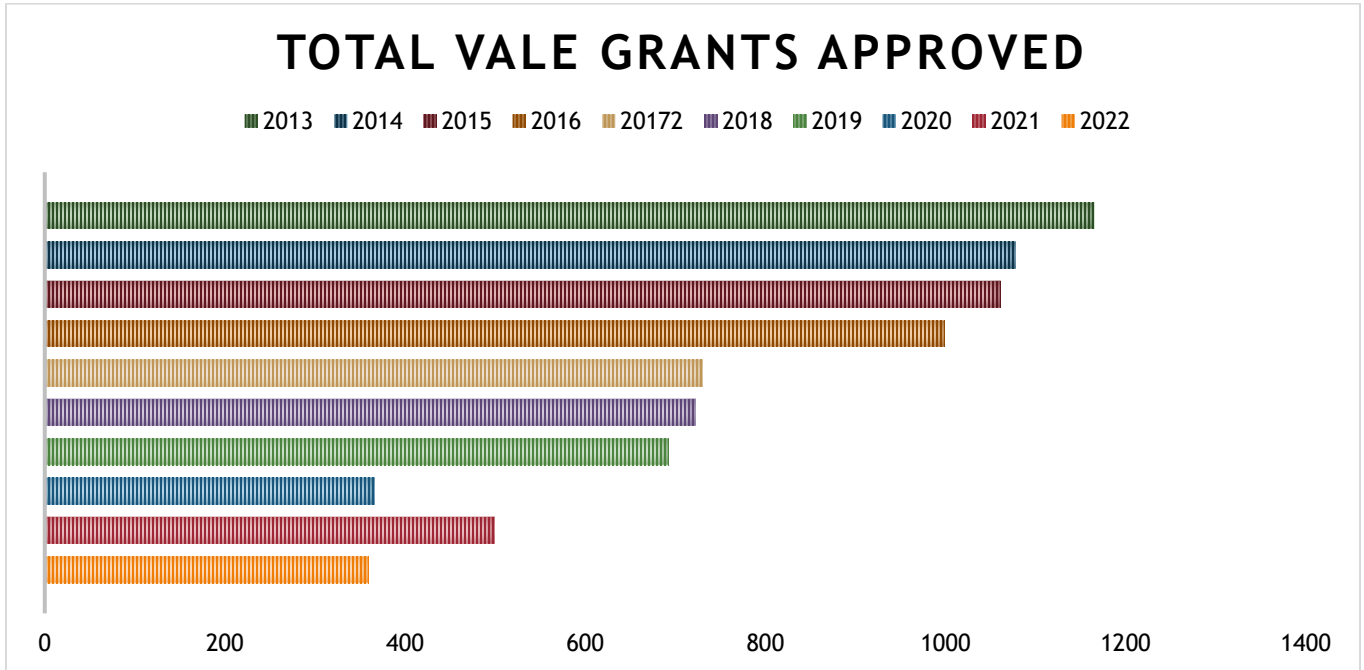

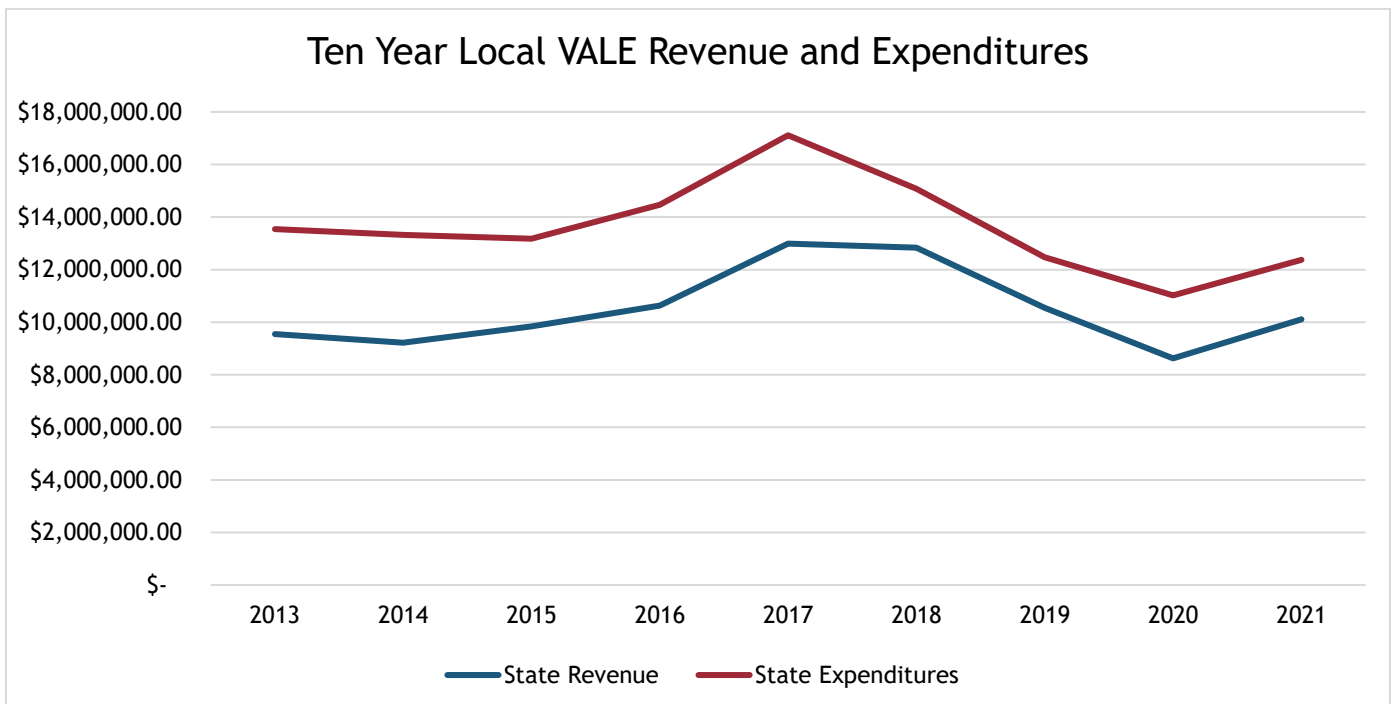
## CY 2013-2022 Number Approved Local VALE Grants and Scholarships

Each local VALE fund has two allocation sources: “Victim Assistance” and “Law Enforcement. VALE Boards generally designate funds to be allocated from the “Victim Assistance” source for grants providing direct services to victims. This includes law enforcement agencies performing victim service related activities. VALE Boards have the statutory authority to determine which source grant funds are allocated from. During CY 22, local VALE Programs also received supplemental ARPA funds to allocate for victim services grants.

## District Attorney Offices VALE Administrative Fund

---

### CY 2022 District Attorney (DA) Offices VALE Administrative Fund Summary

The District Attorney's (DA) Office may use up to 10% of all monies deposited into the local VALE fund pursuant to C.R.S. §24-4.2-103(4) for the administrative costs incurred to assist the Board in the performance of its duties and for the preparation of Victim Impact statements required by statute.

The overall statewide difference between local VALE administrative fund revenue and expenditures has remained relatively parallel and static since 2005. It is important to note that the *local VALE program administrative costs incurred by DA Offices have steadily increased* since 2005. District Attorney Office VALE Administrative funds are used primarily for personnel salary and benefit expenses (75%). An additional 16% is expended for supplies and operating expenses related to VALE grant and board administrative services, victim assistance services, and Victim Impact Statements (VIS) expenses.

Beginning in 2009, the calendar year end fund balance for local VALE Administrative funds has steadily decreased. The percentage of DA VALE Administrative funds sufficient to pay for allowable C.R.S. §24-4.2-103(4) administrative expenses has decreased from 54% in 2017 to 35% in 2022. Other funding sources for these expenses come from grants and/or in-kind support. The majority of local VALE programs (17 of 21) are spending 75% to 100% of monies deposited into the administrative fund account each year.

### CY 2022 DA Office Administrative Funds for VALE Grant Management

---

Local VALE grant funds awarded to agencies to provide direct victim services have increased approximately 35% from calendar year 2005 to 2022 while funds available to administer these grant awards has remained at 10% since 1996. Nationwide, non-profit victim service administrative budgets range 15% to 25%. Data maintained, and included in annual reports by the Office of Victims Programs, clearly demonstrates that the 10% local VALE administrative deposits received by DA offices is significantly insufficient to pay allowable VALE program administrative expenses pursuant to C.R.S. §24-4.2-103(4). On average, DA offices pay for 42% of allowable C.R.S. §24-4.2-103(4) administrative expenses.

## CY 2022 VALE District Attorney Administrative Fund Activity

Table 7 outlines the expenditures and revenue for the 10% administrative funds statutorily authorized to District Attorneys' Offices for VALE grant and board administrative services, victim assistance services, and Victim Impact Statements (VIS) expenses.
