SCR roll out		Statutory rollout beginning. Have info on 3 cases will begin SCRs next month with consensus. 1 voluntary SCR and 2 for cause.
Research analysis for Teletherapy		<p>Research team presented presentation analysis results. Background: prior to 2020 Appendix I did not allow teletherapy; revised in 2021 to allow due to COVID-19. Outcomes: mental health teletherapy not inferior to in-person treatment, CBT most effective for teletherapy, attrition rates are greater for less experienced therapists. Lack of studies is a limitation for this subject and conversation.</p> <p>Providers have an overall positive attitude regarding teletherapy. Some concerns noting emotional connection, privacy and legal issues. Benefits are access to care.</p> <p>Data size of 1,448 client records from the DVOMB PDMS and provider data input into Reliatrax.</p> <p>Results: 757 or 52.3% received group teletherapy tx, 50.3% group overall. 13.1% received individual tx. 4% received both teletherapy and in person tx. 45% in person only tx. Discharge info: 38% in person, 51% teletherapy for completed discharge. Unsuccessful discharge: 55% in person and 39% teletherapy only.</p> <p>Overall length of tx was 7.2 months.</p> <p>Takeaway is clients in teletherapy only were in treatment longer. Majority of clients are in Level C treatment. However, level C has more in person treatment 51% as teletherapy only at 39% for Level C offenders.</p> <p>Limitations: Do not know if teletherapy caused the differences seen in tx length or outcomes. Selection bias, limited info on mixed modalities.</p> <p>More analyses are needed including additional factors that may help narrow in on the impact of teletherapy on client outcomes.</p>
