

## 2020 – Antiterrorism Emergency Assistant Grant (AEAP) Assistance Special Conditions

The following program specific requirements are imposed by the Federal sponsoring agency concerning special requirements of law, program requirements, and other administrative requirements. These requirements apply to this Agreement and must be passed on to subgrant award recipients.

1. The Grantee agrees that federal funds under this award will be used to supplement but not supplant state or local government funds.
2. The Grantee agrees to submit all financial and programmatic reports as requested by DCJ.
3. The purpose of this award under the OVC Antiterrorism and Emergency Assistance Program is to enable the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice to provide support to the victims of the mass violence shooting at the STEM School in Highlands Ranch, CO on May 7, 2019. The alleged gunmen killed 1 and injured 8 other students leaving 1,867 students and their families, 160 school staff members, and police and other emergency personnel who responded to the scene traumatized as well. Funding will provide supplemental crime victim compensation, crisis response, consequence management, and criminal justice support services to help victims continue to heal and cope with probable re-traumatization.

Consequently, the subject federal action meets OJP's criteria for a categorical exclusion as contained in paragraph 4 (b) of Appendix D to Part 61 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Additionally, the proposed action is neither a phase nor a segment of a project which when viewed in its entirety would not meet the criteria for a categorical exclusion.
