TRAINING with IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT

Through training, staff are introduced to concepts and skills necessary to perform their duties. With established and continuous competency, leadership and organizational supports in place, staff have the necessary resources to engage in ongoing skill development; bridging the gap between research and practice ultimately improving outcomes.

CONSULTATION

Providing accurate information and facilitating discussions around Colorado Community Corrections Standards, Community Corrections Information and Billing System (CCIB), Program Assessment for Correctional Excellence (P.A.C.E), Policies and Procedures, and Core Security Audits to support program excellence and quality improvement.

Using the P.A.C.E and Core Security Evaluations, the Integrated Technical Assistance Team can assist in the determination of strategic planning priorities that may inform a direction for future practice improvement.

Case Planning: Developing SMART case plan goals relevant to 1) criminogenic needs and 2) the client.

Motivational Interviewing: Tips for developing Empathy and Partnership in Community Corrections staff, as well as cultivating change talk and softening sustain talk.

Behavioral Interventions and Skill Training with Directed Practice: Strategies for forming Communities of Practice, and educating staff and management on these EBPs.

Contingency Management: Effectively integrating appropriate responses to desirable and undesirable behavior.

Integrated Technical Assistance Services: Our teams will respond to your agency's requests in a timely and professional manner. It is our goal to enter into a collaborative working alliance with community corrections boards and programs requesting services.
