COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS Diversion Specialized Offender Services Fund

The following is a list of services that <u>may be</u> eligible for funding from the SOS fund source.

SEX OFFENDER OFFENSE SPECIFIC TREATMENT

Diversion clients convicted of sex offenses who are NOT in a sex offender specialized bed. (Sex offender specialized beds are paid an additional 'differential' amount via contract with DCJ.) Funds for polygraphs may be approved, however, the funding is limited to \$250 per polygraph. Polygraph funding may be denied if a client has a history of failed polygraphs.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Clients with histories of domestic violence who are required to attend Domestic Violence treatment. Services must be provided by qualified counselors approved by the Domestic Violence Management Board.

ANGER MANAGEMENT

Clients requiring anger management groups may be considered for funding through SOS as long as the treatment is not in conjunction with Substance Abuse groups and is eligible under Correctional Treatment Funding.

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Clients in need of mental health services who are NOT in a specialized RDDT bed may be eligible for treatment funds through SOS. All treatment must be provided by licensed, clinical treatment specialists.

SERVICES THAT WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR FUNDING

The following services are excluded from the Specialized Offender Services process because of the limited amount of funding available for community corrections offenders in the state.

Substance Use Treatment - addressed with Correctional Treatment Funds, IRT, Peer I programs, and other resources such as OBH.

Seriously Mentally III - Solicit funding or other support from the Department of Human Services or, if a Transition client, from the DOC.

In-patient Medical Expenses - offenders are required to pay for their own medical expenses.
