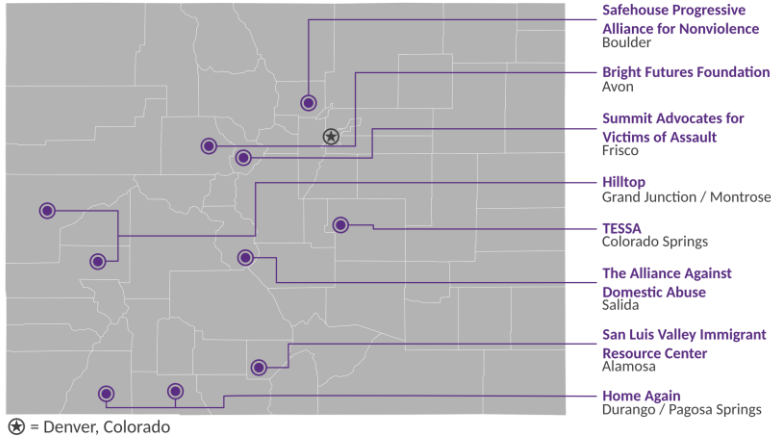


# The Colorado Housing for Crime Victims

## SPECIAL PROJECT



From May 2017 to Dec 2018, 8 sites implemented a housing for crime victims initiative.



And provided these services:

- ✓ Direct financial support for housing expenses
- ✓ Mobile advocacy
- ✓ Housing search & navigation
- ✓ Landlord advocacy
- ✓ Financial management and budgeting
- ✓ Case management and goal setting

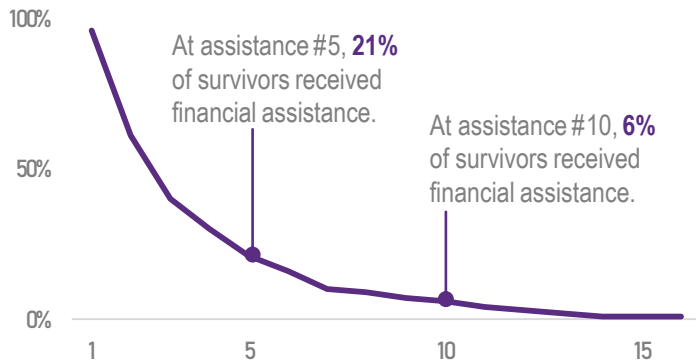


### Financial Assistance Provided (per person)

RANGE \$14-\$20,815  
MEDIAN \$1,397

90% were able to keep or obtain housing as a result of their FIRST housing assistance

### MOST SURVIVORS RECEIVED ASSISTANCE ONLY A FEW TIMES



51% stayed in their current housing



Another 39% obtained housing

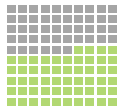
Most funding came from the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance fund & supported rental assistance (84%)



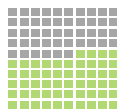

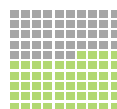
96% were female
