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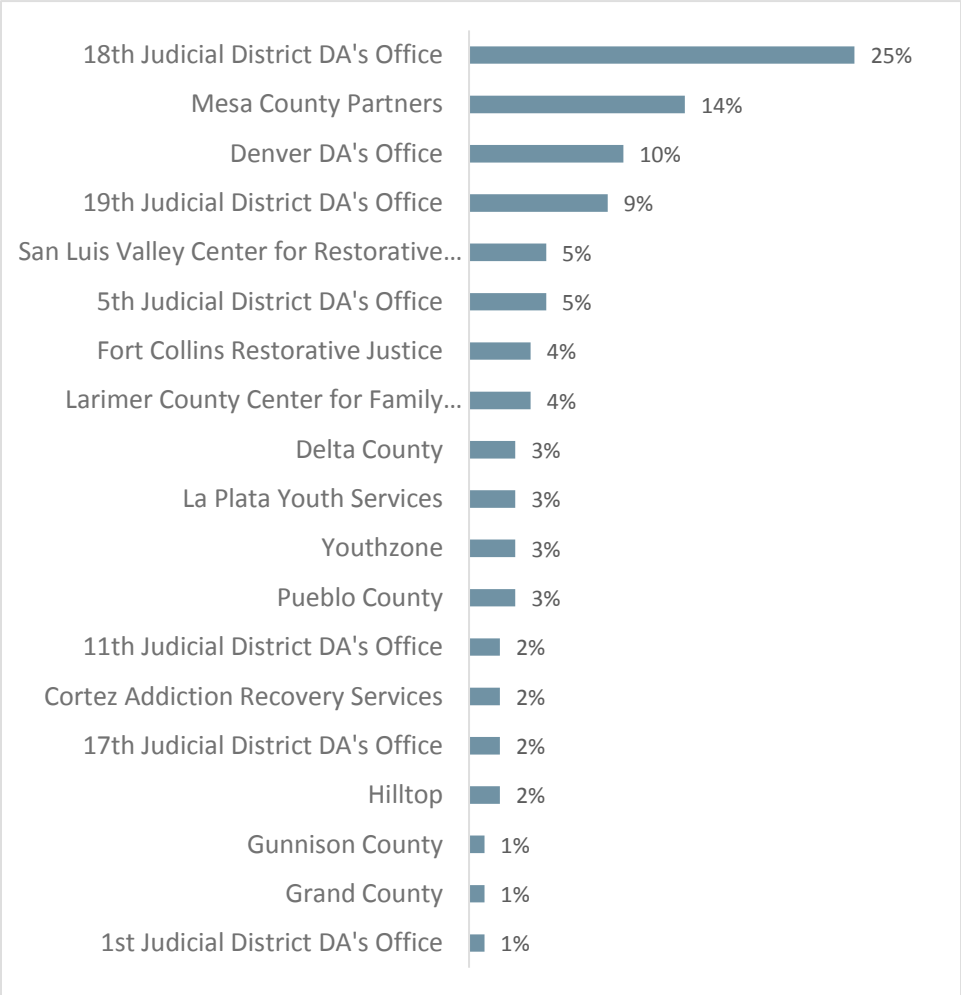

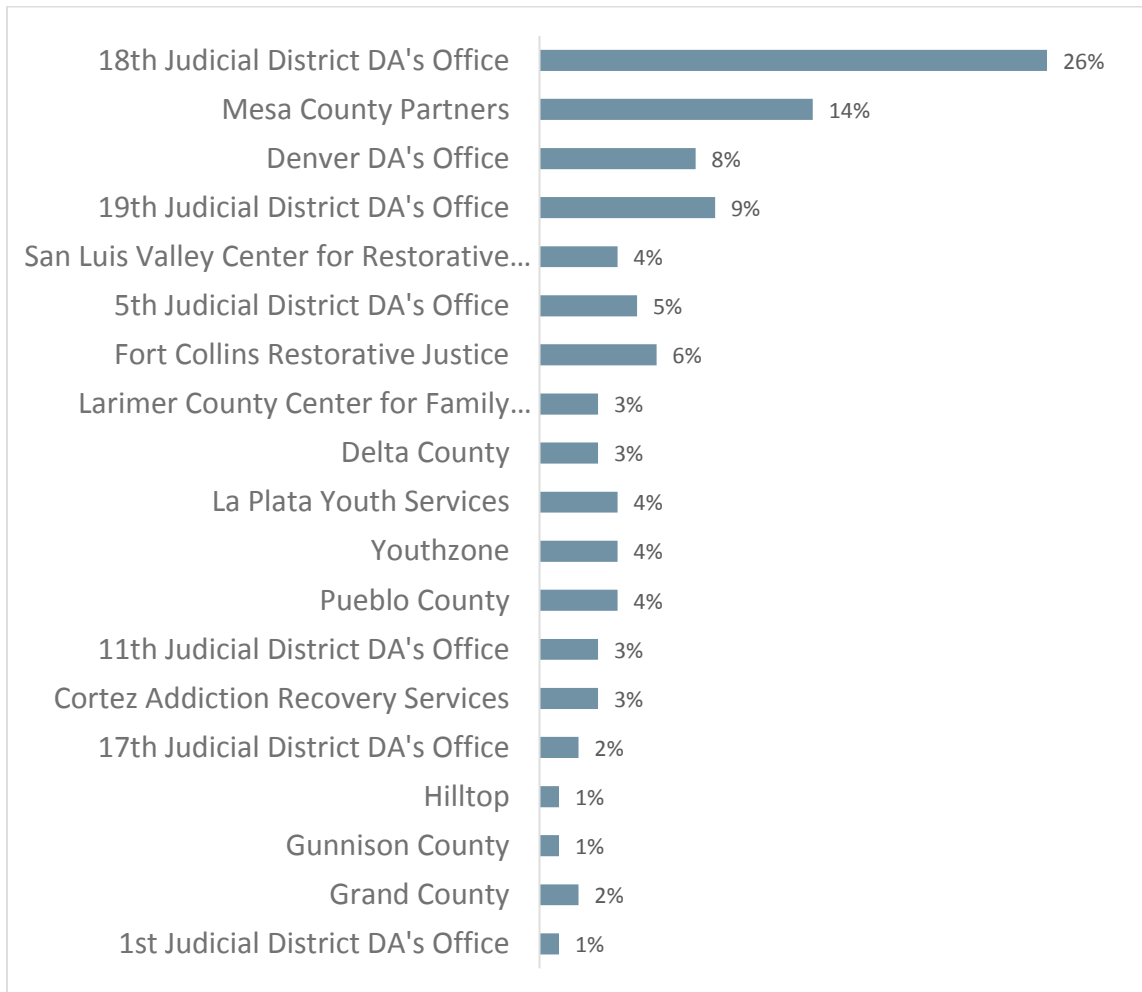

Figure 3: Diversion Participants by Program (n=1207)

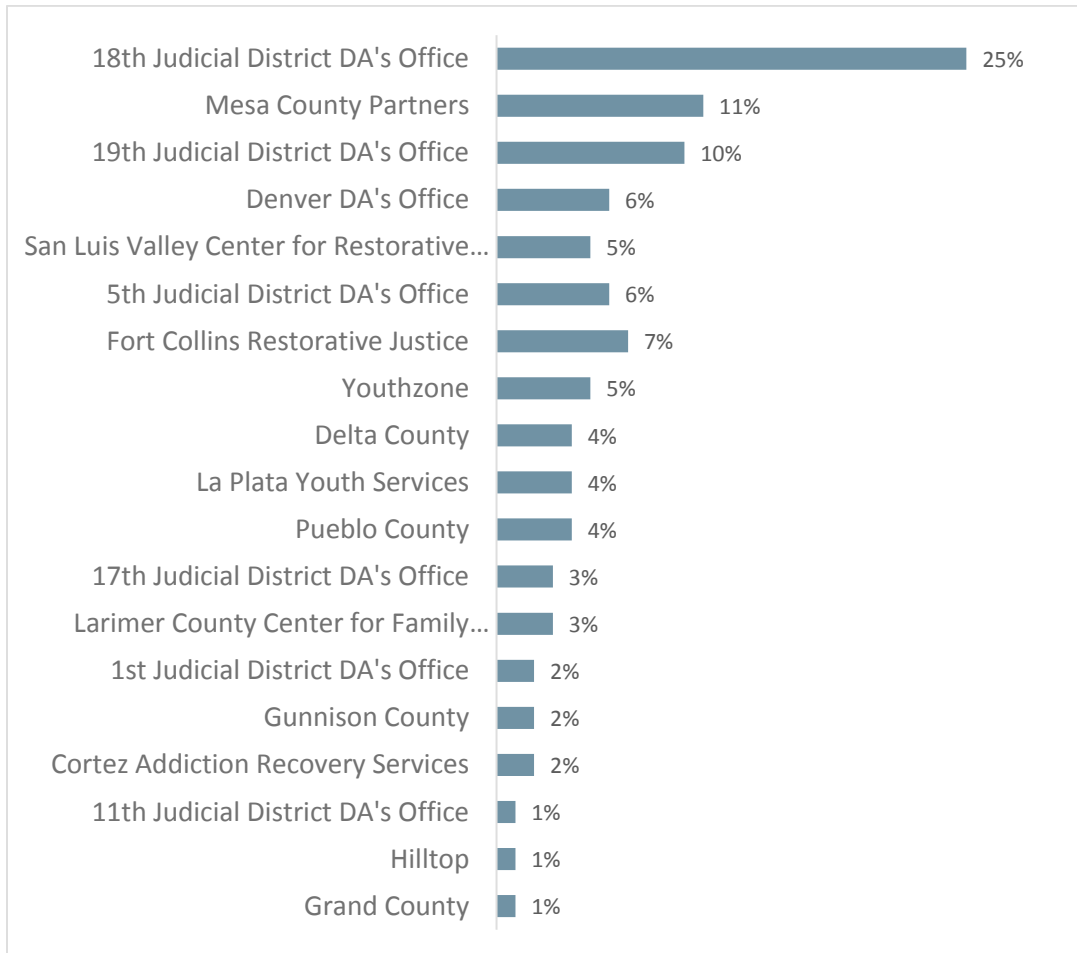
