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QUESTIONS

1. I am reading through the instructions and I am only seeing that I submit through ZoomGrants. Is it correct that I do not need to submit a paper copy?

Yes, the entire application is completed and submitted on ZoomGrants, a paper is not necessary.

2. The grant application instructions seem to indicate that only government departments and agencies are eligible to apply for indirect costs. Are we eligible with our state diversion funding? If so, is there a maximum amount that we can apply for?

Agencies eligible for State Juvenile Diversion funds are able to request indirect in their budget. The percentage that you may include in the budget will be either the applicant agency's federal negotiated indirect cost rate or the "de minimus rate," which is 10% of the Modified Total Direct Costs.
