the CCIC and NCIC database that are missing arrest data in order to provide a complete criminal history record to law enforcement and

criminal justice agencies without delay.

PROJECT TITLE: "CDAC Interface Defendant Reconcile"

Agency: Colorado District Attorney's Council

Federal Award: \$123,982

Summary: The goal of this project is to design and build a defendant reconciliation

system that will reconcile defendant changes. With five District Attorney Offices using different case management systems, the ability of CDAC to manually match defendants is becoming increasingly difficult, resulting in disconnected and inaccurate criminal histories that do not show a defendant's complete criminal history. When defendant records are merged or defendant data changes, these changes will be transmitted

electronically to and from the Open Interface partners.

PROJECT TITLE: "CICJIS Technology Environment Upgrade"

Agency: Colorado Integrated Criminal Justice Information System

Federal Award: \$50,000

Summary: The goal of this project is to replace existing technology with an open

technology in order to continue the facilitation of information sharing among the five criminal justice agencies the Colorado Integrated Criminal Justice Information System (CICJIS) serves. CICJIS is unique to Colorado, as well as any other justice information system in the United States. CICJIS allows data sharing among the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI), Colorado District Attorney's Council (CDAC), Colorado Department of Correction (CDOC), Colorado Department of

Youth Corrections (CDYC), and Colorado Judicial Department.
