## **COLORADO ACTUARIAL RISK ASSESSMENT SCALE - VERSION 7**

The Division of Criminal Justice/Office of Research & Statistics is mandated to develop a risk assessment scale that, "shall include criteria that statistically have been shown to be good predictors of the risk of reoffense. The division of criminal justice shall validate the Colorado risk assessment scale at least every five years...." [17-22.5-404(2)(a), C.R.S.]. The CARAS Version 7 (2021) comprises 12 items.

<b>2. Most Serious Crime Classification</b> The felony classification number associated with the most serious crime. 5. Substance Abuse Needs Level The substance abuse (SA) needs level according to the most recent assessment. 8. Most Serious Crime: Property Crime Whether the most serious crime associated with the current incarceration was a property crime. ## **CARAS 7 RISK GROUP CATEGORY and RISK PROBABILITY**

The values of the 12 items above are combined to produce a risk probability. The CARAS 7 Risk Groups comprise five categories based on the risk probability as follows:
