Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ)

DCJ can help in numerous way including:

The Emergency Preparedness and Response Division is dedicated to providing helpful and informative resources in the areas of disease, natural disaster, terrorism and other emergency threats.

Division of Homeland Security & Emergency Management Office of Emergency Management

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) is responsible for the state's comprehensive emergency management program which supports local and state agencies. Activities and service cover the five phases of emergency management:

1. Prevention
2. Protection
3. Mitigation
4. Response
5. Recovery

The Office of Emergency Management supports all hazards and disasters like flooding, tornadoes, wildfire, hazardous materials incidents and acts of terrorism.

Planning and training services to local governments include financial and technical assistance as well training and exercise support. Services are made available through local emergency managers supported by OEM staff assigned to specific areas of the state.
