SV	0	* Colorado Department of Law/Attorney General's Office	\$ 76,059	Grant funding will support one Victim Advocate to provide statutorily mandated victim services under the Victim Rights Act (VRA) to those victims whose cases are handled by the Attorney General's Criminal Justice Section and Appellate Unit.
SV	0	* Colorado Judicial Branch/Office of the State Court Administrator – Division of Probation Services	\$ 54,393	Grant funding will support an equivalent of a .75 FTE Victim Assistance Coordinator; however, the FTE will be distributed among several Judicial Districts. This program is designed to maintain victim assistance programs in probation departments throughout the state, and to ensure that Colorado probation departments are in compliance with the Victim Rights Act (VRA).
SV	0	* Colorado Department of Corrections (DOC)	\$ 132,996	Grant funding will support 1.5 positions in the Victim Services Unit (VSU). This unit provides: 1) information on the status of offenders in DOC to victims who are registered in the Victim Notification program; 2) assistance and support to victims who attend Colorado Parole Board Hearings and Community Corrections Board reviews; and, 3) referrals to other victim services providers.
SV	0	* Colorado Department of Human Services/ Division of Youth Corrections (DYC)	\$ 29,449	Grant funding will provide partial support for the Victim Services Coordinator who is responsible for ensuring that the rights of all victims enrolled in the victim notification program are provided.
SV	0	* Colorado State Patrol (CSP)	\$ 173,837	Grant funding will support several Victim Advocates positions around the state that provide comprehensive services to victims of traffic crashes (and their families) on Colorado highways where an injury or death occurs. The advocates ensure compliance with the Victim Rights Act (VRA).
SV	0	* Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI)	\$ 18,000	Grant funding will support a portion of the costs of genetic testing for sex offenders using DNA analysis. This grant award is mandated by statute C.R.S. § 17-2-201(5)(g)(III).
SV	0	* Colorado Department of Human Services/Juvenile Parole Board (Includes competitive award of \$13,153)	\$ 76,114	Grant funds will provide salary support for the Victim Services Coordinator position. This position ensures that victims rights are protected during the critical stages of the State's juvenile parole process.

SV	0	Colorado Organization for Victim Assistance (COVA) (Statewide Training etc.)	\$ 236,716	Grant funds will provide partial support for six positions (Executive Director, Deputy Director, Chief Deputy Director, Training Coordinator, IT Coordinator and Administrative Assistant). Funds will support the training program, the annual statewide conference, and the Victim Assistance Academy training program. Funds will also support the administration of the Victim Services Intern Program, the Crime Victim Emergency Fund, the Victim Service Provider Communication and Collaboration network and Special Events.
SV	0	Colorado Organization for Victim Assistance (COVA) (Emergency Fund)	\$ 35,000	This grant continues the Crime Victim Emergency Fund. These funds are provided by the Colorado Department of Corrections Prison Industries Enhancement Program. Based on a Federal requirement, these funds must be used to directly compensate victims of crime. This fund is used for emergency needs of victims that are not covered by Victim Compensation funds. This grant does not compete with other grant applications that receive grant funds.
SV	0	Colorado Judicial Branch/Office of the State Court Administrator, Division of Probation Services	\$ 159,724	Grant funds will support partial funding of salaries for eight Victim Services Officer positions in the 3rd, 6th, 7th, 10th, 11th, 14th, 15th and 22nd Judicial Districts. Officers will provide crime victims with information on their right to receive notification of critical stages while the offender is on probation; provide notifications of changes in the offender's status for victims who opt-in to the notification program; and provide direct victim services and referrals.
SV	0	Colorado Coalition Against Domestic Violence (CCADV)	\$ 95,550	Grant Funds will provide partial salary support for six positions (Executive Director, Assistant Director, the Advocacy & Resources Director, the Advocacy and Resources Coordinator, Public Policy Director and the Business Manager positions. Funded activities include statewide training, the annual conference and an advanced advocacy institute.
SV	0	Families of Homicide Victims & Missing Persons	\$ 14,000	Grant funds will provide partial support for three positions (Executive Director, Victim/Family Coordinator & Outreach Coordinator). Funds will support outreach to co-victims of unsolved homicide cases, raise public awareness about cold cases, outreach to law enforcement, maintenance of a cold case database, and an annual conference.
SV	0	Rocky Mountain Victim Law Center	\$ 95,000	Grant funds will provide partial support for three positions (Executive Director, Lead Attorney and the Staff Attorney). The agency provides legal representation to victims of crime with VRA enforcement issues. Funds will also be used for outreach to service providers, law enforcement and prosecutors.
SV	0	Colorado Nonprofit Development Center	\$ 45,000	Grant funds will provide partial support for three positions (Director of Sustainability, Director of Training/Education and Director of Advocacy). Funds will provide services to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer victims of domestic, sexual, hate and bias motivated violence. Funds will also provide training to stakeholders within the victim services community.
SV	0	Colorado Department of Personnel & Administration	\$ 69,053	Grant funds will support one FTE Administrative Assistant to assist with enrolling victims in the program and forwarding their mail, as well costs associated with forwarding mail to victims. The Colorado Address Confidentiality Program protects the confidentiality of a victim's location by providing a legal substitute address and a confidential mail forwarding system.

SV	0	Colorado Legal Services	\$ 136,662	Grant funds will support the partial salaries of five Attorney positions and one paralegal to provide victims of domestic violence with civil legal assistance, including protection order cases, in seven Judicial Districts (1st, 2nd, 4th, 10th, 17th, 18th, and 19th).
SV	0	Voices of Victims	\$ 37,600	Grant funds will provide partial support for the Executive Director. Funds will be used to provide post-sentencing support & advocacy to victims of violent crime as they attend parole hearings and community corrections board reviews.
