Dear Superintendents and BOCES Directors:

Happy New Year! As a school person this always feels like the real New Year to me. I know you must be busy preparing for the students to arrive and we wanted to offer our assistance and some information.

You are probably aware of the 2015 legislation that was passed that impacts schools. SB15-213 Waive Governmental Immunity for Acts of School Violence and the companion bill SB15-214 that formed the Safe Schools and Youth Mental Health (SSYMH) Committee will have a bearing on all school safety related work especially as a definition of "reasonable care" is developed.

The SSYMH Committee had its first meeting on Tuesday, July 14th where the School Safety Resource Center, Safe2Tell and the Colorado Society of School Psychologists offered information to the group. As a member of the committee, if you have any specific information pertaining to the committee's question of, "What do we need to be doing that we aren't doing right now to keep students safe?" I would be happy to share your comments with the committee. As you probably know, David Crews, Superintendent of the Norwood School District, is also serving on the committee. Committee meetings are open to the public and the next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, August 27th at the Capitol.

We will host the no-cost **Colorado Safe Schools Summit on October 14**th **and 15**th at the Adams 12 Star Conference Center. We have a wonderful slate of plenary speakers and 24 workshops tracked for school personnel, mental health professionals or emergency response partners. I have attached a flyer and a <u>link</u> for the electronic version of this letter. <u>We ask that you</u> <u>forward the electronic version of this letter to your building administrators</u>. Thank you!

We have another <u>grant opportunity</u> for twelve schools to do some intensive positive school climate work. Twelve schools are already working with us on a previous grant with the same goals and their projects have included conducting a climate survey and then having the school's team receive technical assistance as they decide upon efforts to enhance the school's climate. Funds are available with both grants for stipends, substitutes, and other resources to support the efforts. We are accepting applications until Monday, August 17th.

Finally, we are collaborating with the Colorado Department of Education on a **School Emergency Management** grant. Centennial BOCES, San Juan BOCES and the Thompson School District are coordinating workshops for 100 district teams to upgrade their emergency response plans. Again, funds are available for stipends, substitutes and/or travel. More information and contacts for the three host agencies are attached <u>here</u>.

Thank you for all you do for the students of Colorado and I wish you a safe, successful school year. Please contact the Center if we can be of assistance.
