THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the 2017 Needs Assessment Survey!

Not surprisingly, the top two identified needs included **secondary traumatic stress** (STS), sometimes called vicarious trauma, training for staff and **creating trauma-sensitive classrooms**. The Center does have a no-cost interactive workshop on STS so feel free to contact Dustin Hunter, the Center's School Outreach Consultant, for scheduling. Dustin.hunter@state.co.us

As many of you know, we have previously worked with the state's Department of Human Services, Office of Behavioral Health on **trauma for educators.** Ashley Brock-Baca, PhD. the Trauma-Responsive Service Array Developer can be contacted directly for assistance with creating trauma-sensitive classrooms. We hope to host another collaborative training with Dr. Brock-Baca sometime in the early summer. Ashley.Brock-Baca@state.co.us

The third highest identified need was for **strategic communication during a crisis event.** Please feel free to contact Brad Stiles, Emergency Response Outreach Consultant here at the Center, for ideas on how to enhance your emergency communications. <u>Brad.stiles@state.co.us</u>

Unfortunately, the Center has no grant funding to assist you with equipment purchases but your county emergency management office may have homeland security funding that could help. Here is a <u>link</u> to the list of emergency managers across the state.

A number of you also mentioned a continuing need for more mental health services in your communities. We understand your concerns. In the meantime, please remember that each of the 17 community mental health centers across the state under the Child Mental Health Treatment Act, are responsible for having a school liaison to your district. The state also provides services through Colorado Crisis Services who contract with each community mental health site. Colorado Crisis Services include a mobile crisis unit, respite care, phone support and other resources. Finally, the non-profit agency Second Wind Fund Inc. (SWF) has therapists in many of our communities that can provide up to 12 sessions of therapy for any suicidal student at low or no-cost (depending upon the family's insurance or lack thereof). Referrals are made by school staff to SWF.

Finally, let me take this opportunity, on behalf of the entire staff, to wish you and yours a wonderful, rejuvenating holiday season. We look forward to working with all of you in the new year!
