THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Greetings: As we enter into our *Tenth Year* of operation, it gives me great pleasure to present our <u>2017 Legislative</u>

<u>Report!</u> Once again staff members were busy as we increased our trainings from 168 to 186 with a total of 7,384 folks trained in 2017. We hope you will take a few moments to peruse the report and see additional highlights as we are very proud of the work we've been able to accomplish with **YOUR COLLABORATION**. Thank you!

Once again the Center had the pleasure of hosting a very productive working group. Last week, 16 school and community mental health professionals came together to review suicide policies, procedures and protocols across the state. Shortly the **Best Practice Recommendations for Addressing Suicide** we be available on our website.

Two items of importance:

(1) The Office of the Colorado Attorney General, Cynthia Coffman, released a Formal Opinion regarding the Family Educational Rights Privacy Act (FERPA) on January 11, 2018. Please see a copy <u>here</u>.

(2) "Please be aware that SAMHSA's National Registry for Evidence-based Programs and Practices (NREPP) has been discontinued, and that SAMHSA will be reconfiguring its approach to identifying and disseminating evidence-based policies and programs. For more information, please read Assistant Secretary Elinore F. McCance-Katz's <u>statement</u> about NREPP and evidence-based practices."

Finally, the **training staff of the CSSRC** put together a light-hearted, **informational video** on training offerings. Please take a minute to see them in action.
