THE DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Happy New Year!

I hope you all enjoyed a wonderful holiday with your family and friends and feel rejuvenated for the new calendar year.

Here at the Center we are excited to be celebrating the **10th Anniversary** of the **School Safety Resource Center** in 2018. Although the Columbine Commission's report in May of 2001 outlined a number of recommendations to safeguard Colorado schools, the School Safety Resource Center was not proposed until 2008 under SB08-001. The Center was created by the collaborative work of many agencies and individuals across the state. These agencies included the Offices of the Governor and the Attorney General, the Colorado Departments of Education and Public Safety and the Center for the Study and Prevention of Violence at CU, Boulder. Linda Kanan, Ph.D. was selected as the first director of the Center and under her guidance it was established with the highest standards of practice.

The mission of the Center was outlined to collaboratively assist educators, students, parents, emergency responders, and community organizations to create safe and positive school environments for all Colorado students in preK-12 and higher education schools. With an initial Advisory Board of thirteen members as outlined in statute, Dr. Kanan operated the Center without additional staff for the first five months as there was a hiring freeze at the time. In April 2009 she was able to hire a school outreach consultant and an administrative assistant and shortly thereafter a resource specialist.

Now the Center operates with a staff of six and an Advisory Board of nineteen. Additional legislation in both 2013 and 2015 added the emergency response outreach consultant and child sexual abuse prevention specialist positions. I am proud to have started as the first school outreach consultant and have served as the director since January 2012. Brad Stiles, our emergency response outreach consultant, has been with the Center since November 2013. Anthony Wyatt has been our resource specialist since April 2015. Margaret Ochoa has served as our child sexual abuse prevention specialist since April 2016. Melissa Weiss joined as our program assistant in February 2017. Our newest staff member is Dustin Hunter, our school outreach consultant, who has been with us since August 2017. It has proven to be a small but mighty team and I appreciate the hard work of each of them!

The final data for 2017 Center's accomplishments are being collected and charted for the Legislative Report that will be completed shortly, submitted to the Colorado General Assembly and linked on the CSSRC website. This will provide information on all that has been accomplished by the Center's staff since opening in 2008.

We have appreciated the ongoing collaboration of the many individuals and agencies over these last 10 years that have enabled us to provide services to so many schools across the state. We look forward to the next 10 years and all that can be accomplished with your continued support.
